Tutoring opportunities – As needed:

- **Literacy/Title 1** – One-on-one mentoring and tutoring with students who need help strengthening basic literacy skills. Training and orientation provided. Minimum commitment of two hours a week for one semester, please.
- **ELL (English-Language Learning Program)** - ELL teacher needs occasional help in classroom to work one-on-one with non-English speaking students.

Parent reminder calls – The personal touch counts. Sometimes direct parent-to-parent reminders about important meetings, school programs or opportunities are the best way to network and connect. All it takes is a simple phone call made by you.

Career mentoring – Career planning is an essential part of any post-high school goal setting.
