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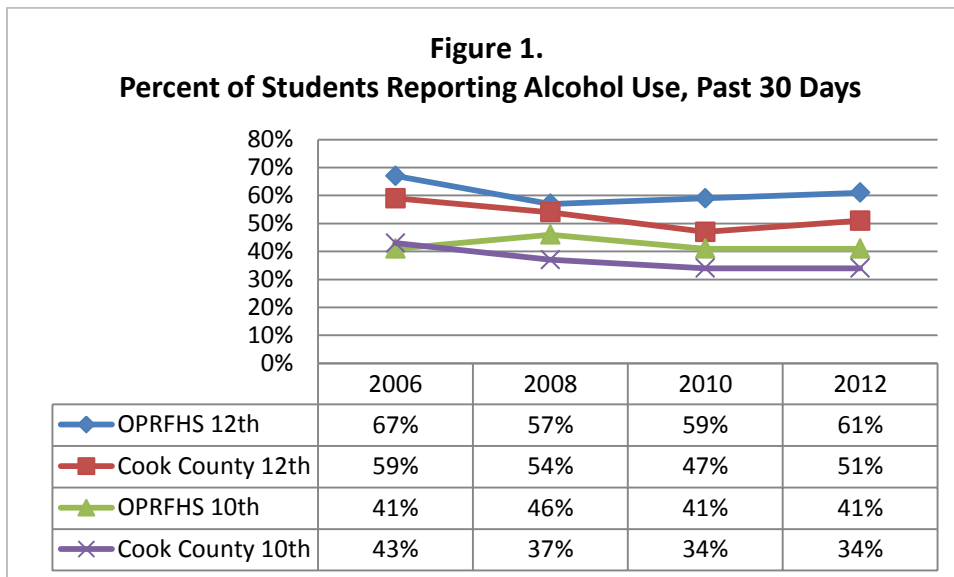
### **BACKGROUND**

Since 2006, on an every-other-year basis, OPRFHS has administered the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS). Sophomores and seniors have completed the survey, which asks questions about a number of topics related to student health and safety. Of primary local interest have been students' responses related to alcohol and other drug use. This report provides a summary and visual displays of several key aspects of students' perceptions and self-reported substance use. The full data set from IYS is also attached for your review.

### **SUMMARY OF FINDINGS**

2012 marked the fourth time OPRFHS has administered the IYS, and we are thus able to make some longitudinal comparisons. The number of respondents has increased over the years we have administered the survey. In 2006, 227 sophomores and 179 seniors completed the survey; in 2012 those numbers were 641 and 561, respectively. Beginning in 2010, we explicitly attempted to survey all students at each grade level rather than half of each class as was the IYS protocol for the previous two survey administrations.

Compared to last year, students' reported use of alcohol in the 30 days prior to taking the survey was unchanged among sophomores (41%) and was slightly higher among seniors (61%) (Figure 1). Rates of use among OPRFHS students continue to be higher than among their peers in the larger Cook County area.

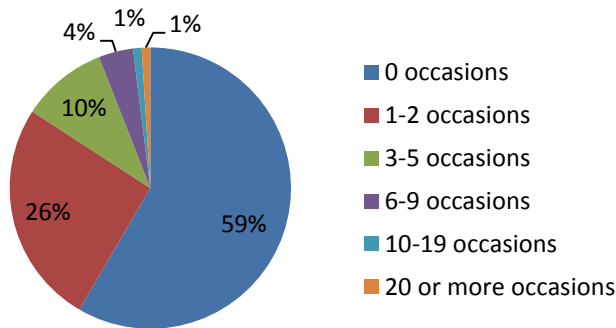


“Past 30 Days” refers to the 30 days prior to when the students completed the survey. For OPRFHS students, that timeframe would have been March-April, 2012.

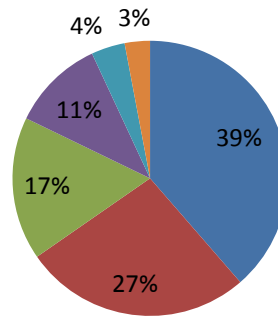

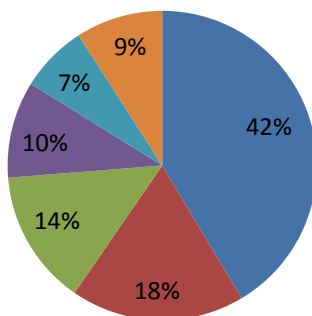
**Figure 2. Incidence of Alcohol Use,

Among students who reported any alcohol use, most sophomores indicated they had used alcohol one or two times in the past 30 days; that rate was also the most common response among seniors who reported use in the past 30 days (Figures 2-3). Rates of use in the prior year were virtually the same as last year: 61% for sophomores and 75% for seniors (Figures 4-5).

OPRFHS Grade 10 (2011-12)**



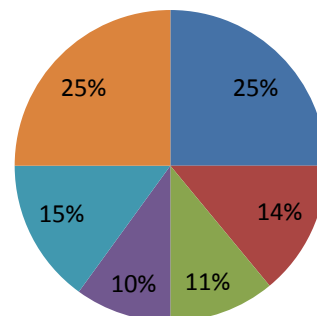
**Figure 3. Incidence of Alcohol Use,

Past Year, Grade 10 (2011-12)**

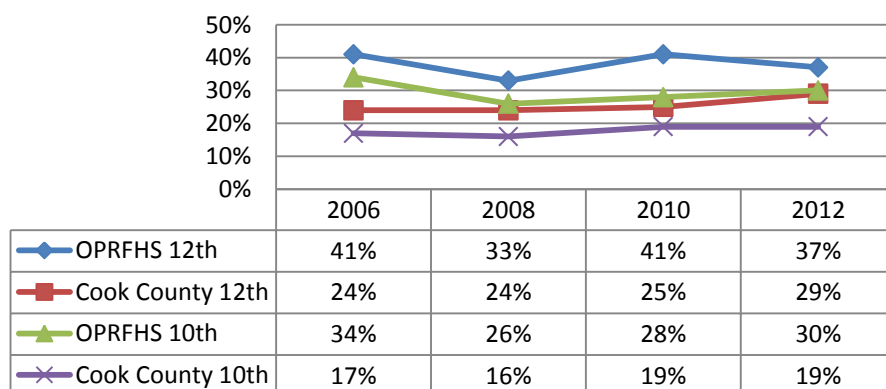


**Figure 5. Incidence of Alcohol Use,  
Past Year, Grade 12 (2011-12)**



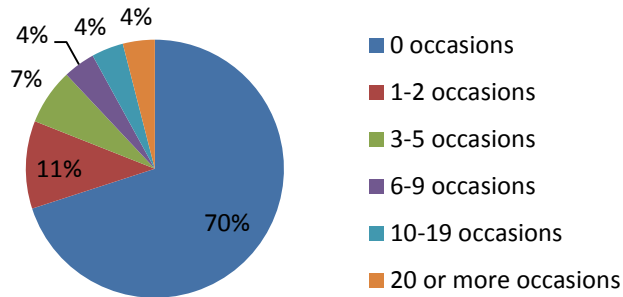
Students' reported use of marijuana is somewhat higher among OPRFHS sophomores and lower among seniors than last year, while trends in the region indicate slight increases in reported use among students at both grade levels over the past four years (Figure 5).

Past 30 Days**

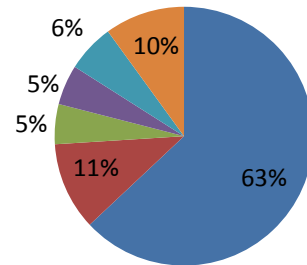

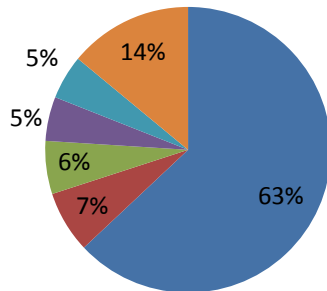
**Figure 7. Incidence of Marijuana Use, Past 30 Days, OPRFHS Grade 10 (2011-12)**



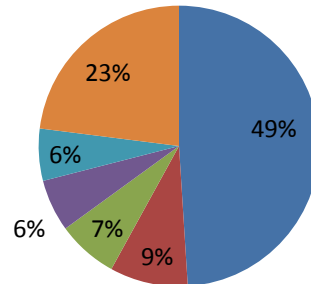
**Figure 8. Incidence of Marijuana Use, Past 30 Days, OPRFHS Grade 12 (2011-12)**



**Figure 9. Incidence of Marijuana Use, Past Year, Grade 10 (2011-12)**



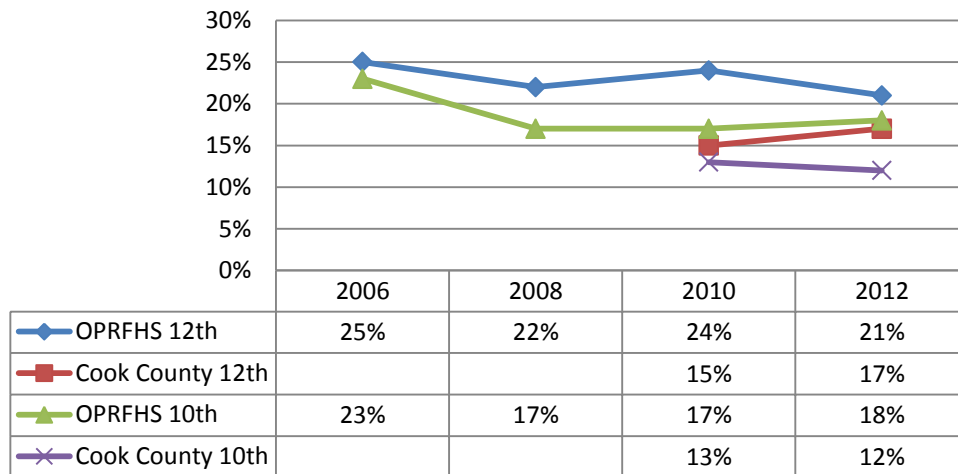
**Figure 10. Incidence of Marijuana Use, Past Year, Grade 12 (2011-12)**



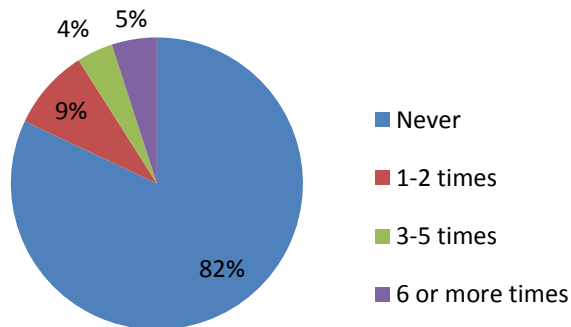

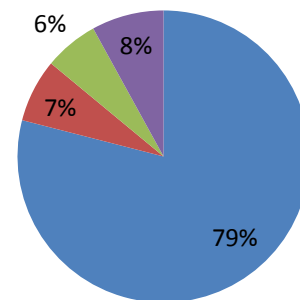
**Figure 11. Percent of Students Admitting to Being Drunk or High at School One or More Times, Past Year**

Students were asked whether they had been drunk or high at school in the previous year; a smaller percentage of seniors and a slightly higher percentage of sophomores answered yes compared to last year, though positive responses among both groups have declined over the past four years (Figure 11). Note that the wording of the question does not provide specific information about **when** students were under the influence at school (e.g. during the school day, at evening events, dances, etc.).

**Figure 12. Percent of OPRFHS Students Admitting to Being Drunk or High at School, Past Year, Grade 10 (2011-12)**



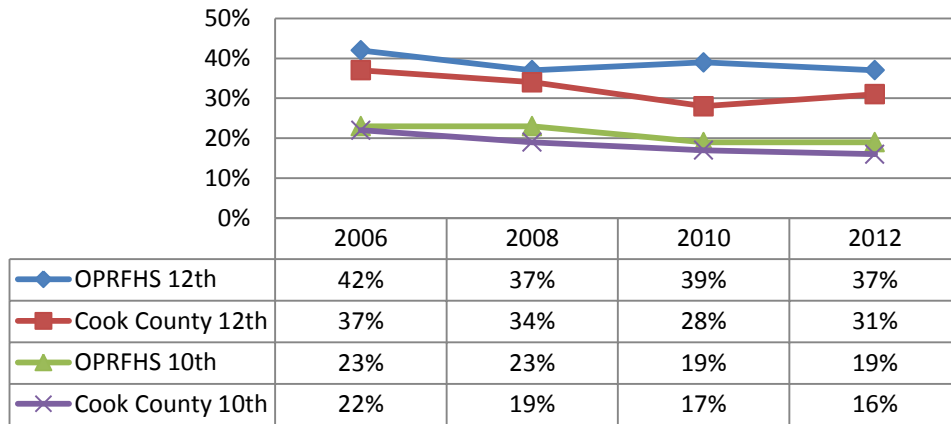
**Figure 13. Percent of OPRFHS Students Admitting to Being Drunk or High at School, Past Year, Grade 12 (2011-12)**



The IYS asks students how many times in the past two weeks they have had five or more alcoholic drinks in a row. That question reflects the definition of binge drinking. Our students' rates of reporting binge drinking are lower, overall, compared to 2006, though there was no change among sophomore rates from last year to this year (Figure 14).

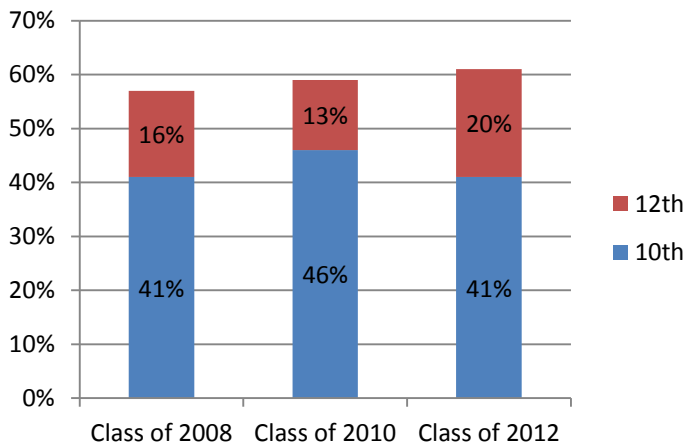

**Figure 14. Percent of Students Reporting Binge Drinking, Past Two Weeks**

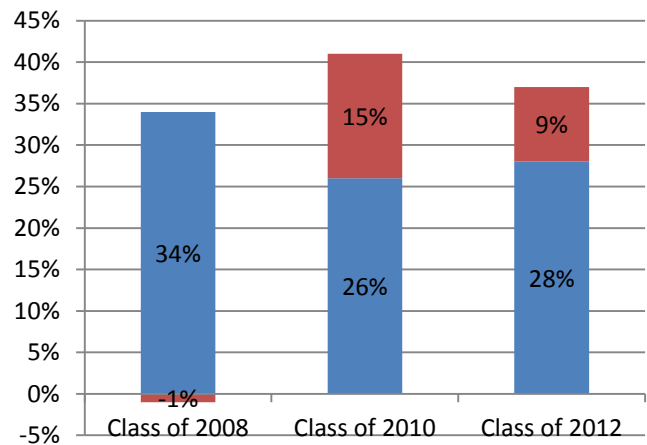


Figures 15 and 16 show how rates of substance use increased from sophomore year to senior year. Each bar represents one group of students surveyed at two points in their high school years. The blue portion of each bar shows the percent of students surveyed who reported in their sophomore year that they had used the substance one or more times in the previous 30 days; the red portion represents the **additional** percent of students surveyed who reported in their senior year that they had used the substance one or more times in the previous 30 days.<sup>1</sup> For the Class of 2008, reported marijuana use was 1% lower when students were surveyed as seniors compared to their results as sophomores (Figure 16).

**Figure 15. Percent of Students Reporting Alcohol Use, Past 30 Days**



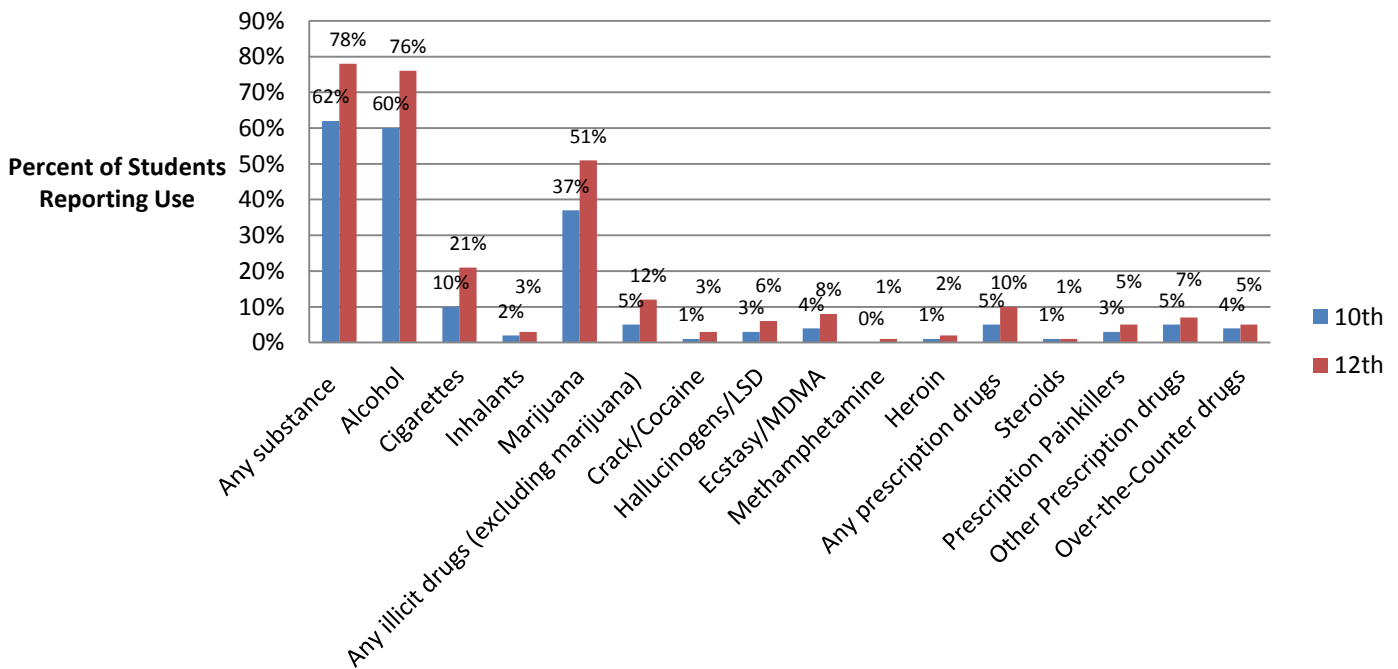
**Figure 16. Percent of Students Reporting Marijuana Use, Past 30 Days**

Students participating in their sophomore year are not necessarily the exact same students participating in their senior year, though given the number of participants at each grade level there is significant overlap between the two groups.

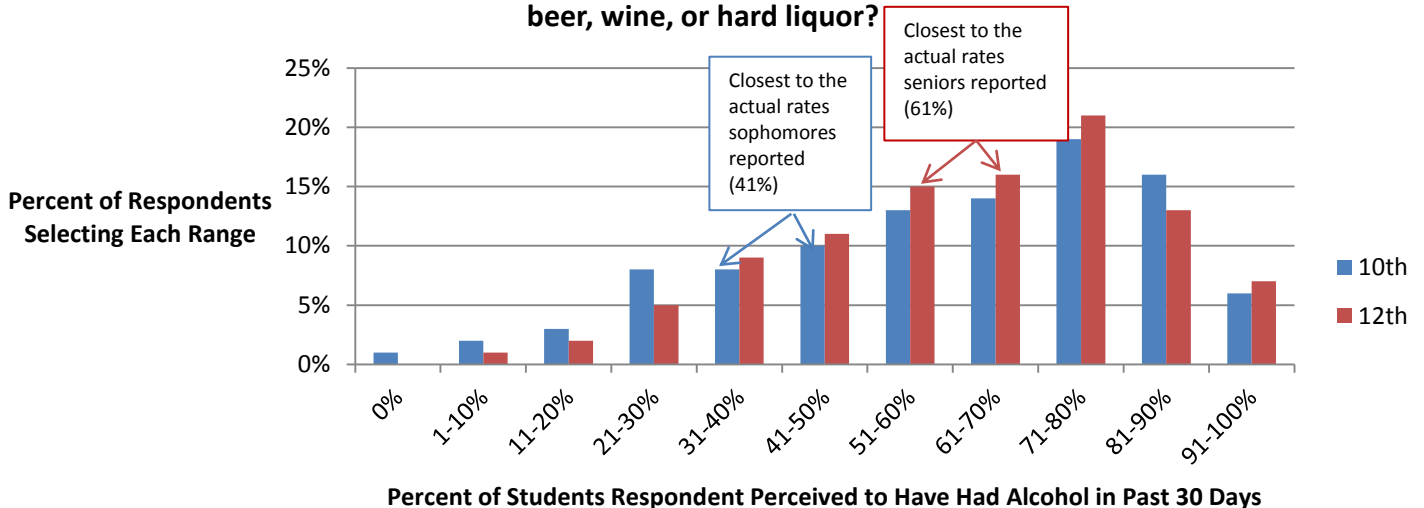

**Figure 17. Rates of Substance Use, Past Year, OPRFHS Grades 10 and 12 (2011-12)**

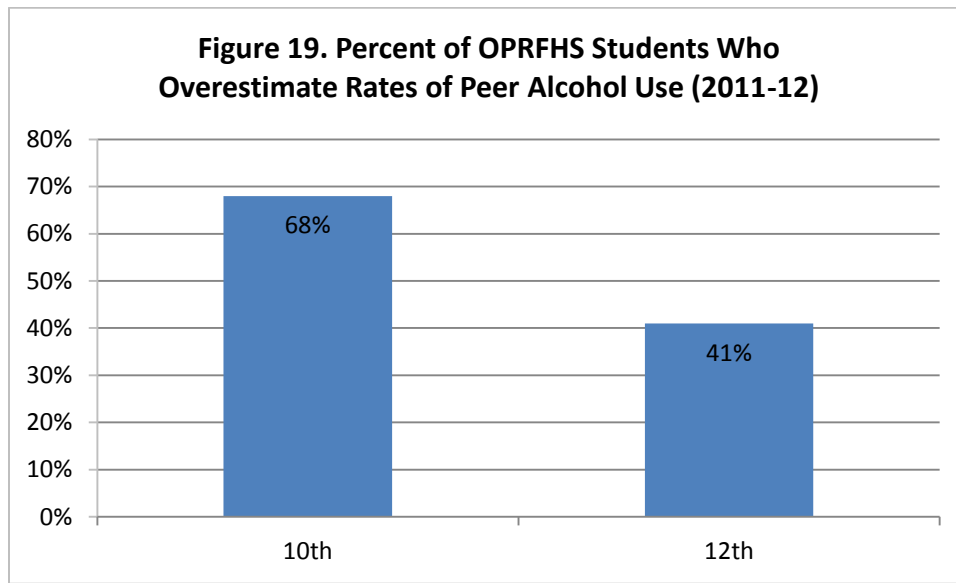


Figures 18-19 pertain to the survey question “In the past 30 days, what percent of students at your school do you think have had beer, wine, or hard liquor.” Figure 18 shows how student responses were distributed across the answer options. For example, about 10% of sophomores responded that 41-50% of their peers had had beer, wine, or hard liquor in the previous 30 days. Compared to actual rates of use reported by sophomores and seniors, the response patterns in Figure 18 show that sophomores, in particular, tend to overestimate the prevalence of alcohol use among their peers. That overestimation may lead to a false notion that “everyone is doing it”, which in turn is linked to a sense of peer pressure to conform and drink alcohol.

### FUTURE DIRECTIONS

We anticipate receiving a follow-up report with additional data near the end of the calendar year that will provide specific indicators of protective and risk factors of particular salience for our community. Those indicators are likely to provide guidance regarding focused preventative efforts most aligned with the needs of our students. In the meantime, we are looking at the data in light of current prevention and intervention efforts by our Substance Abuse Prevention Coordinator, and we are sharing the information with IMPA.C.T. A further course of action would be to seek additional partners with expertise in the analysis of self-reported youth substance use data to deepen our understanding of our students' response patterns and to consider improvements in our prevention and intervention efforts.

## Introduction

Congratulations! Based on your administration of the Illinois Youth Survey (2012), this report provides data on a variety of health and social indicators including drug use, bullying, school climate and much more. Your data has been organized into topical sections as noted in the table of contents on the next page. To help you get started using your data, here are a few suggestions:

Review the table below to determine how widely your students participated in the survey. If the “% of Enrolled Students Reported” is **at least 50% for each grade level**, you can be more confident that the data in your report is representative of your total student population.

There will be NO DATA presented in this report for any grade level with **fewer than 10 valid surveys** (in the column “N Students Surveyed”). This is to protect the confidentiality of your students.

Keep in mind that the IYS 6th and 8th grade forms do not include all questions asked on the IYS high school form. For that reason, responses to some questions do not appear in the tables and charts for some grade levels. If you would like to determine what section includes responses to a specific survey item or verify if a question was asked at a specific grade level, please refer to the Site Report Appendix on our website <http://iys.cprd.illinois.edu/results/individual-school-reports?>.

**Tables can be helpful when** you are looking for a summary of responses for particular survey questions, for example, the percentage of 8th grade youth who report using prescription pain killers to get high. Some tables may contain a mean score (an average of all the responses), a median score (the middle point of all responses given) or an “N” (number of students who responded to that question). Tables can also be useful when you need specific data to support a grant or report. If you see an **“N/A” (Not Applicable)** noted in a table, this indicates that the question was **not asked at that grade level**. If you see an **“N/R” (Not Reported)** noted in a table, this indicates that *at least 90% of students skipped the question for no known reason*, making the results too biased to report.

**Summary charts can be helpful** to view multiple questions in one place (e.g., use of different drugs to determine which is the most used) and to compare your results with the scientific sample of Illinois students who participated in the 2010 IYS. State level results from the 2012 IYS will not be available until late fall. IYS state level norms from 2010 are a good benchmark for immediate decision-making because state estimates stay relatively stable across two IYS administration years. Includes demographic data and other information about the surveyed population.

(2) **Drug Prevalence and Behaviors** ..... 4  
Includes substance use behaviors including type, frequency, and consequences of drug use.

(3) **Drug Use Contributing Factors** .....12  
Includes factors in students, their families and their communities that may increase or reduce the risk of youth substance abuse, such as access to substances and parental communication about expectations to not use drugs.

(4) **Interpersonal Conflict, Violence and Delinquency** ..... 24  
Includes experiences with violence and high-risk behaviors including bullying and fighting.

(5) **Academic and School Experiences** .....26  
Includes youth opinions of their academic experiences, their school environment and engagement in youth activities.

(6) **Mental, Social and Physical Health** ..... 31  
Includes a variety of mental and physical health issues including thoughts about depression/suicide, nutrition, and physical activity (including estimates of obesity).

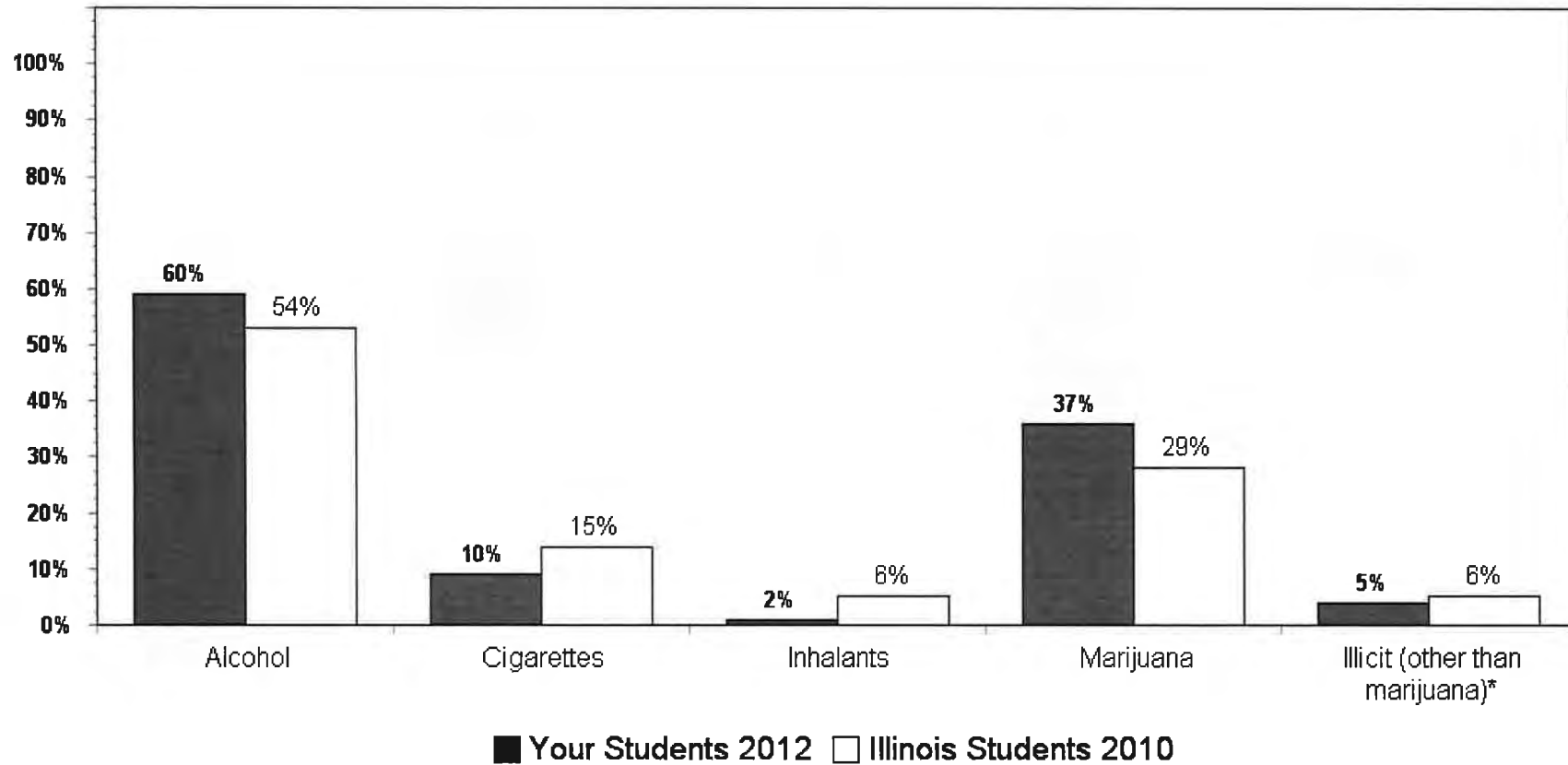

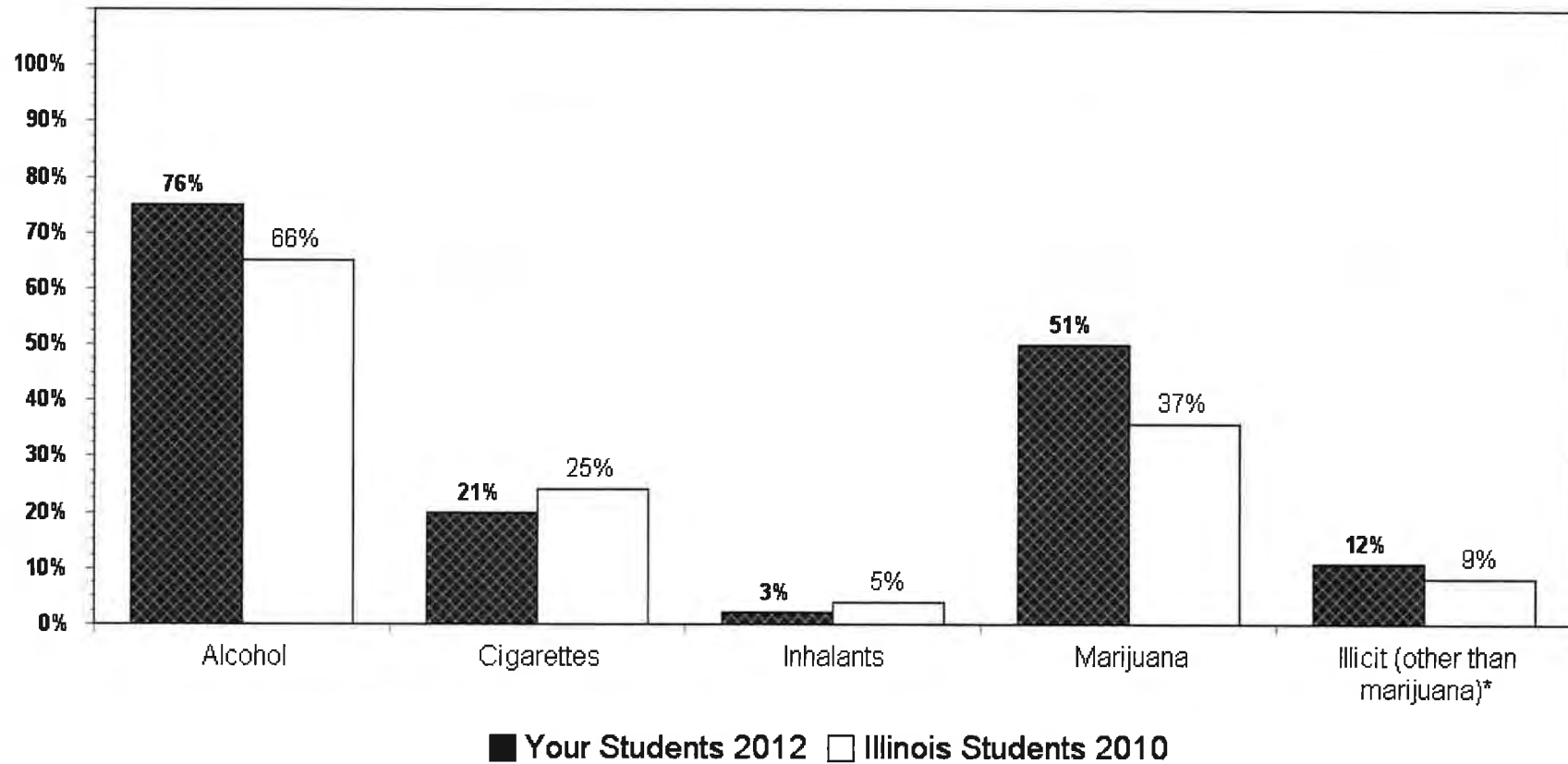
## Substance Use in the Past Year Among 10th Grade Youth

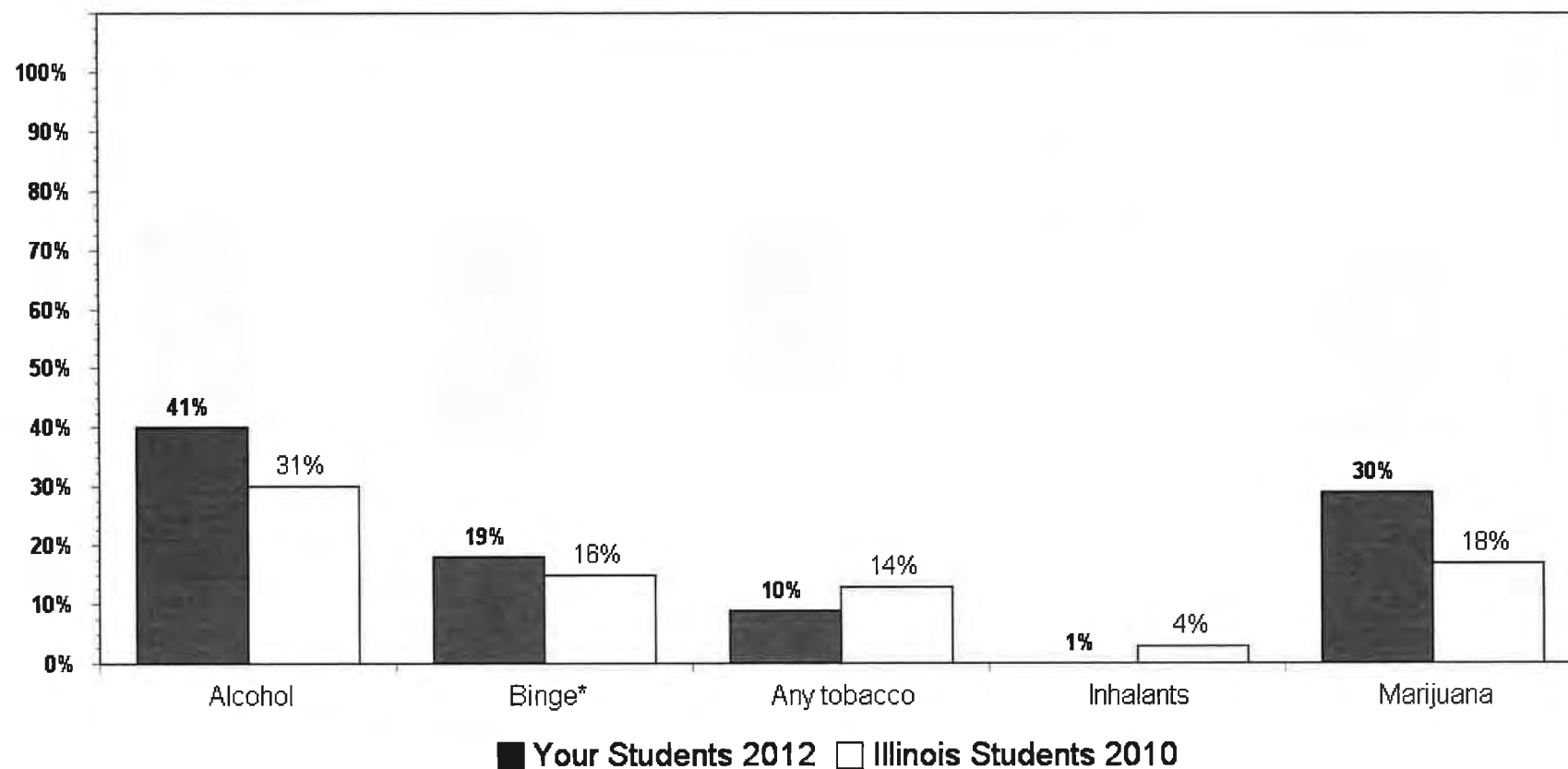


## Substance Use in the Past Year Among 12th Grade Youth



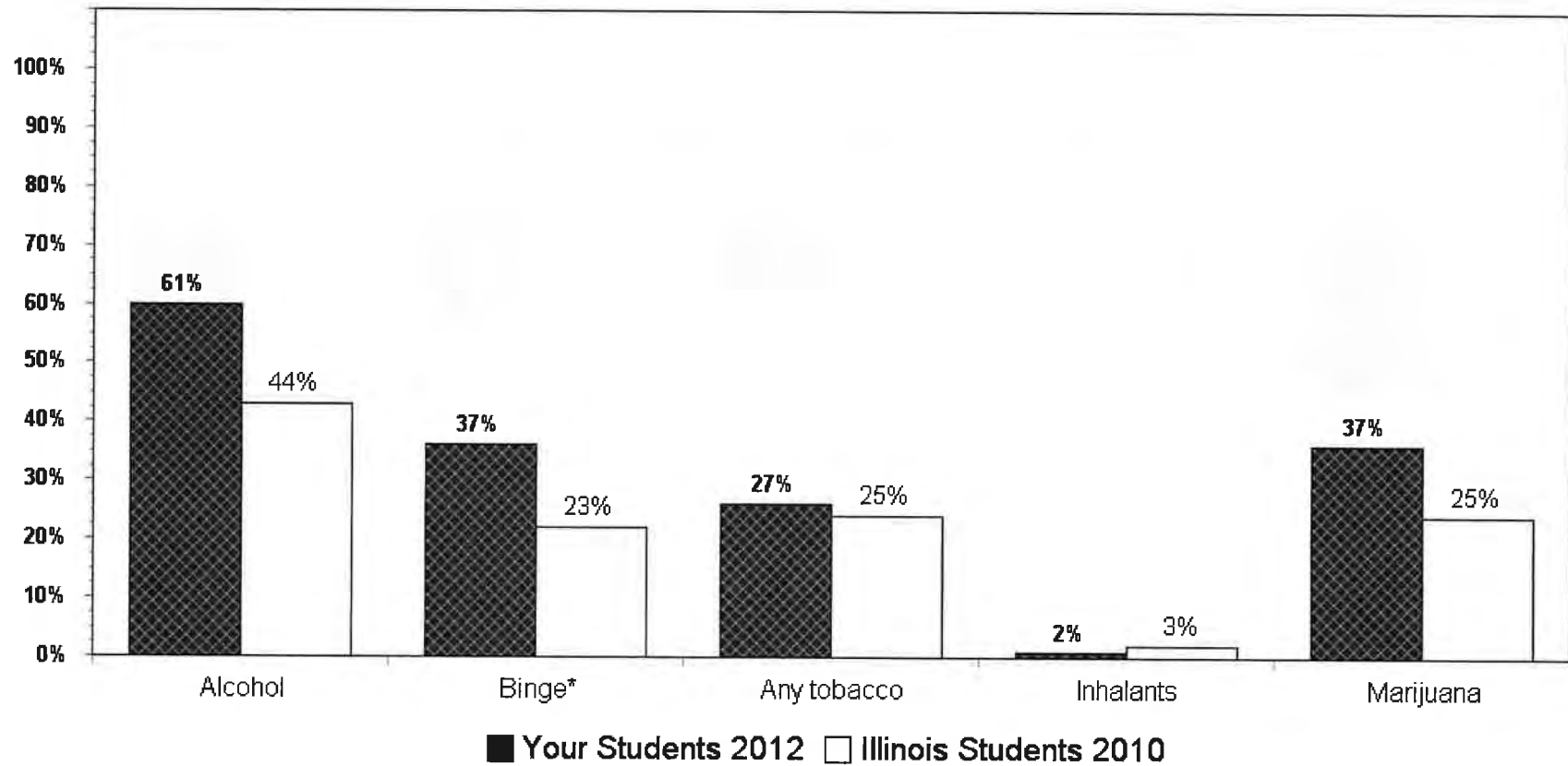

## Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 10th Grade Youth



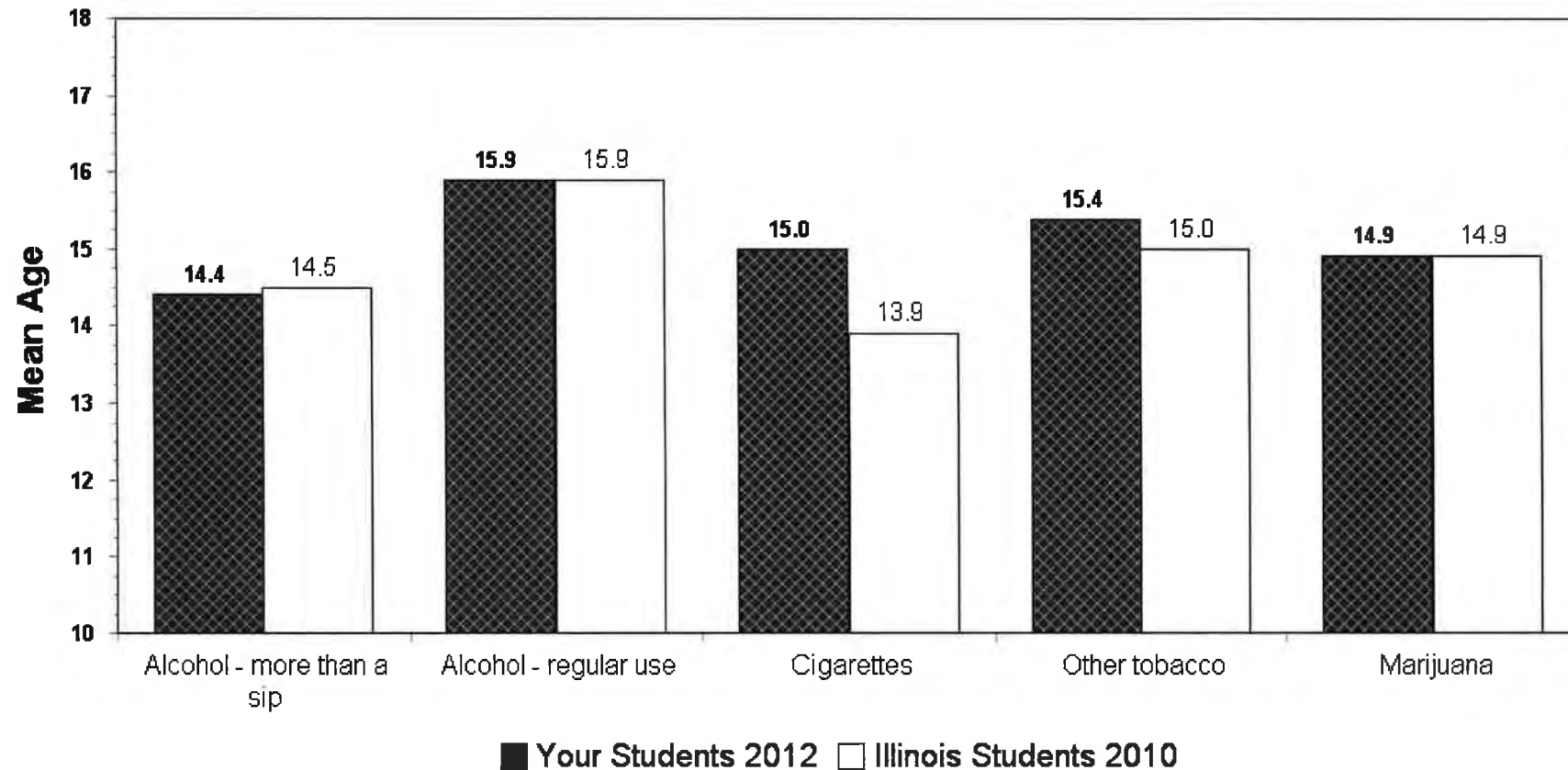

## Substance Use in the Past 30 Days Among 12th Grade Youth



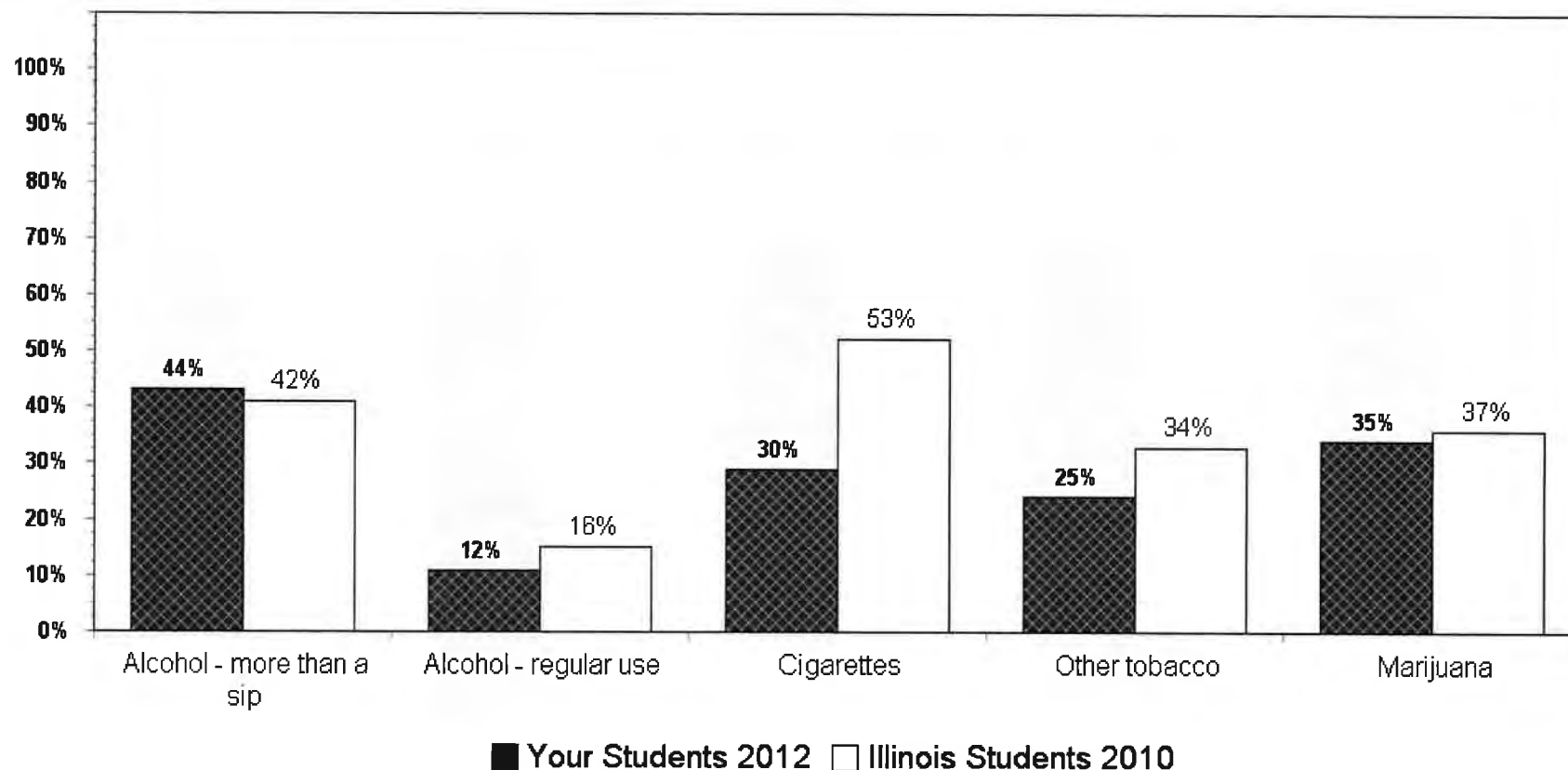

Among 12th Graders Having Ever Used the Drug\***



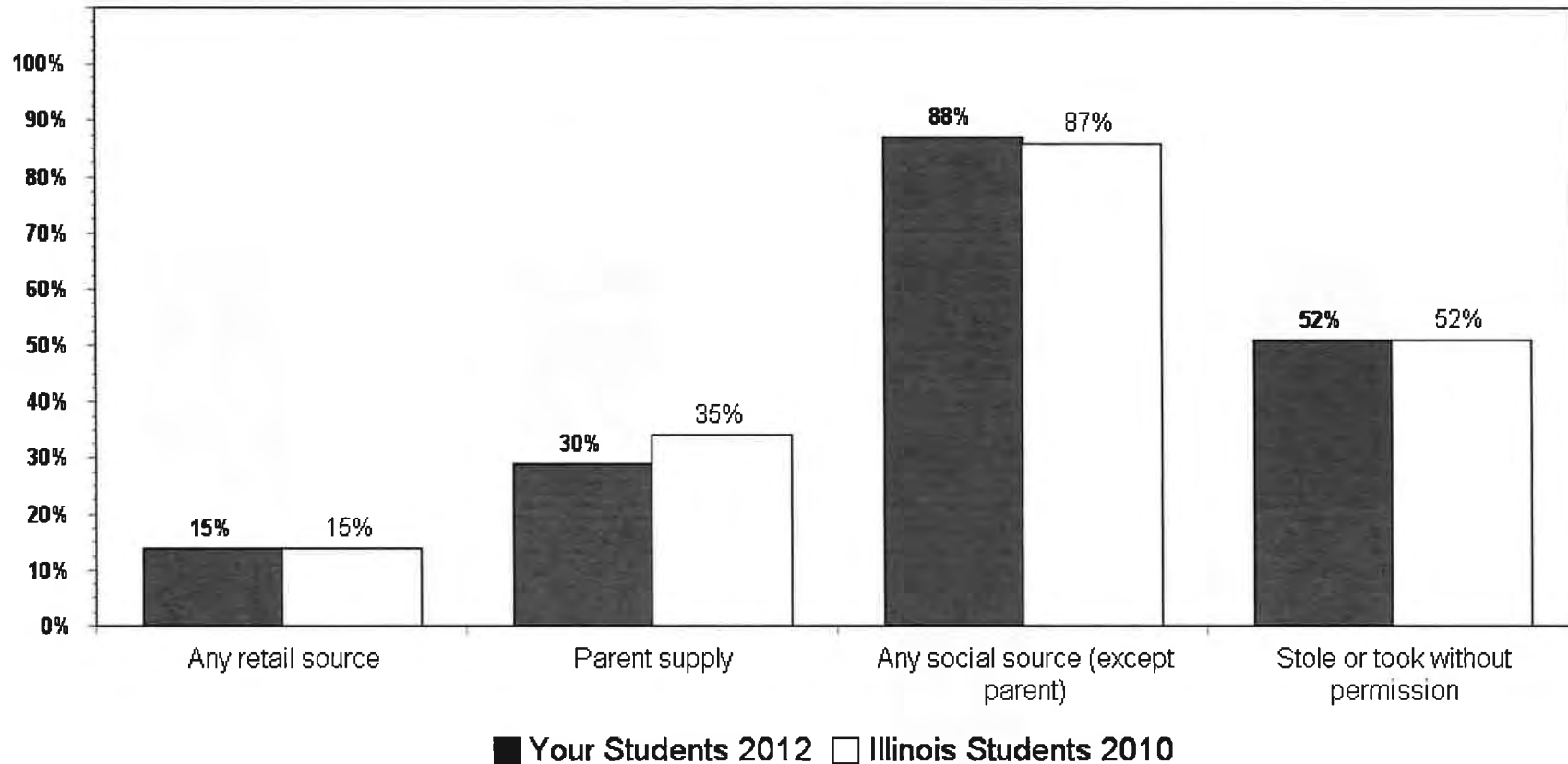

Among 12th Graders Having Ever Used the Drug\*



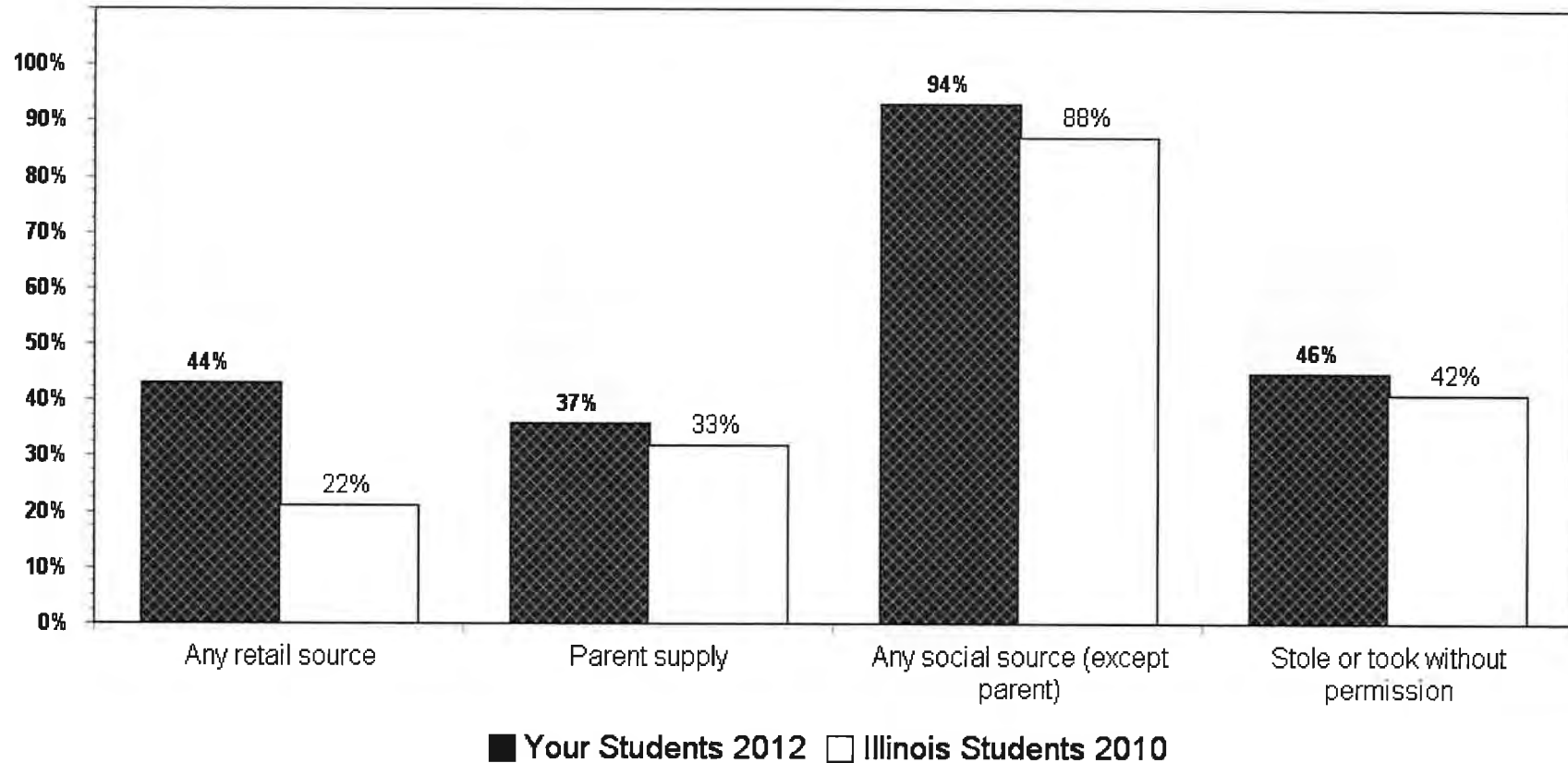

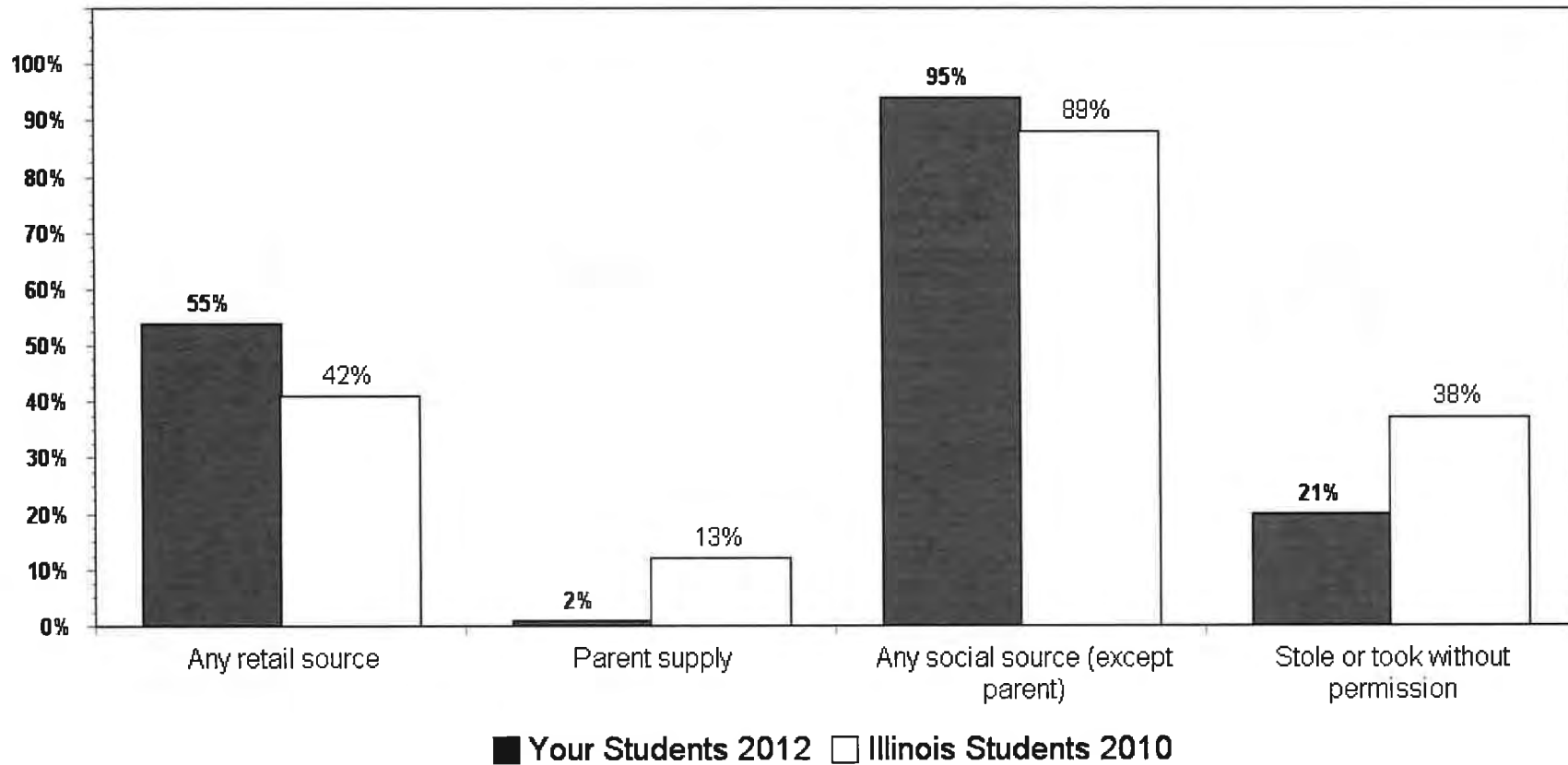

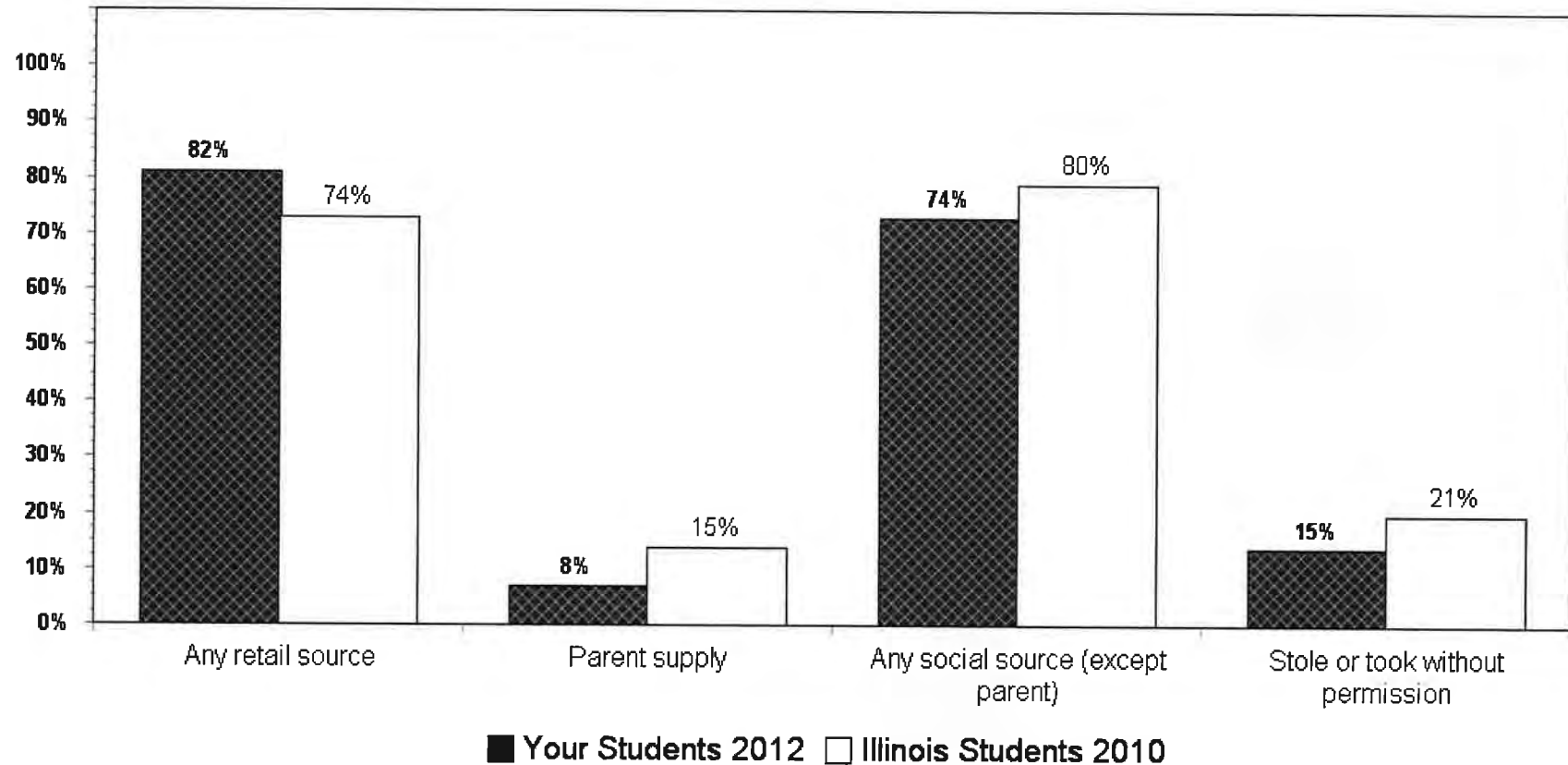

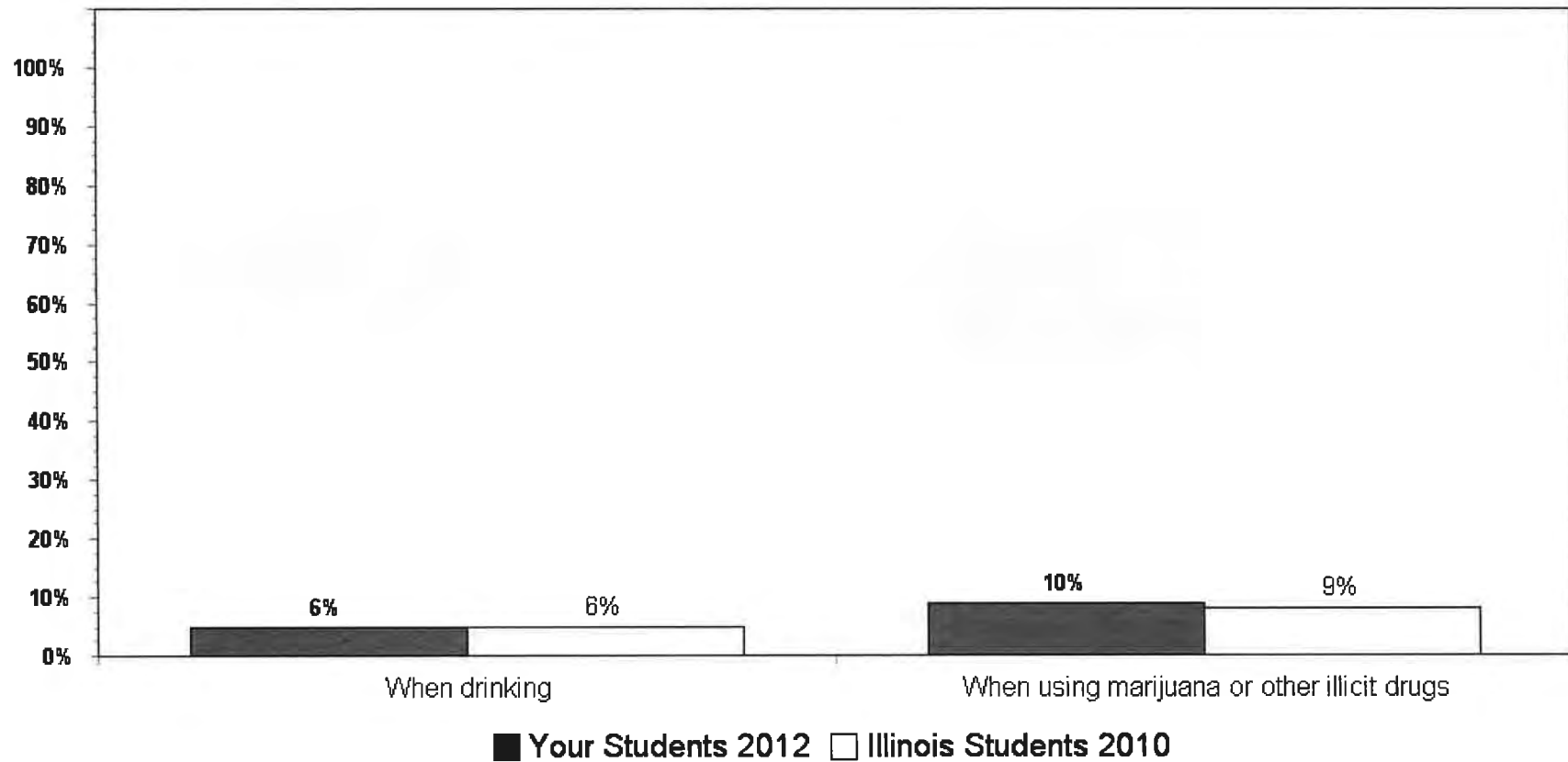


### Source of Tobacco in the Past Year Among 12th Grade Tobacco Users\*

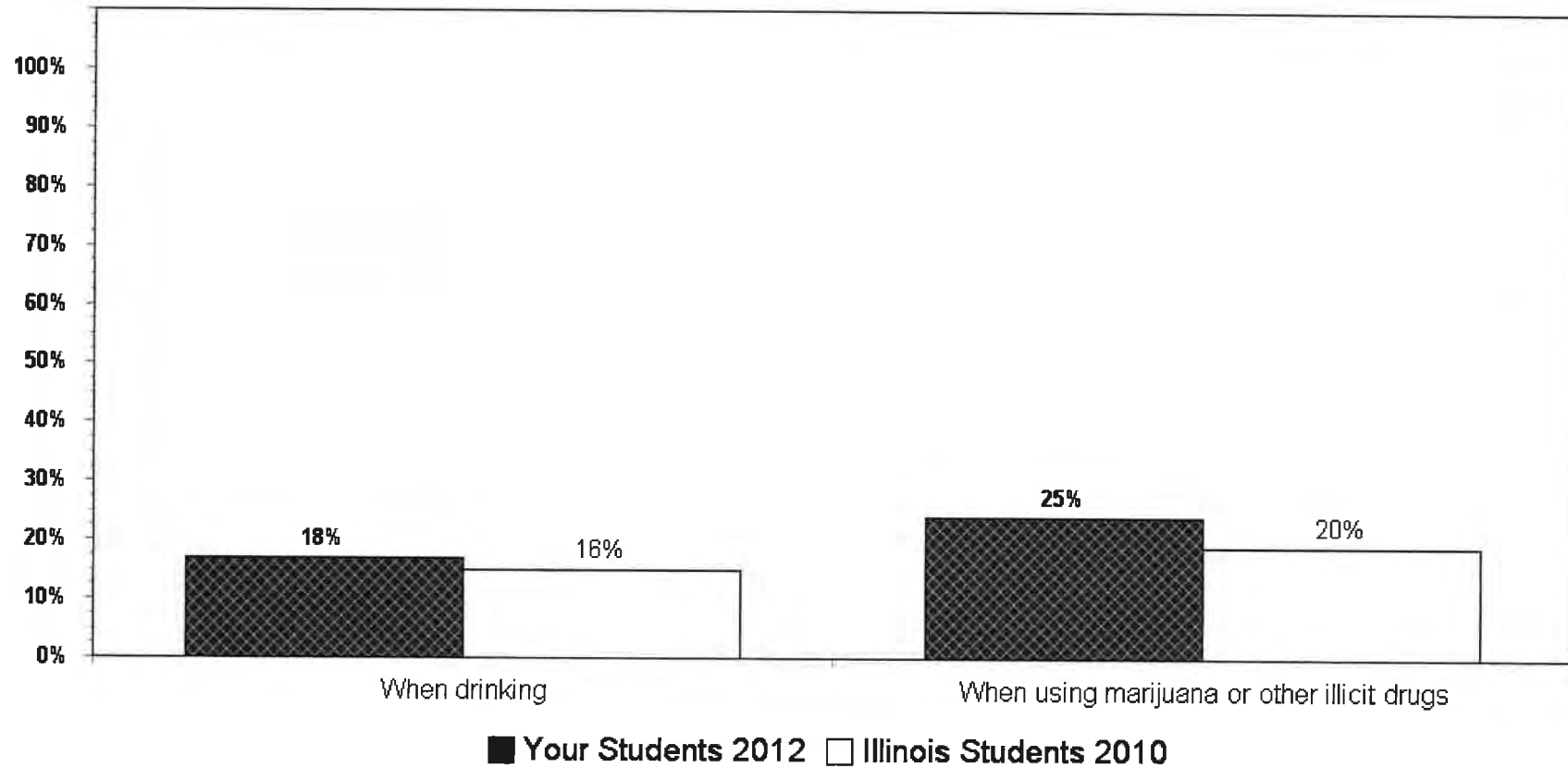

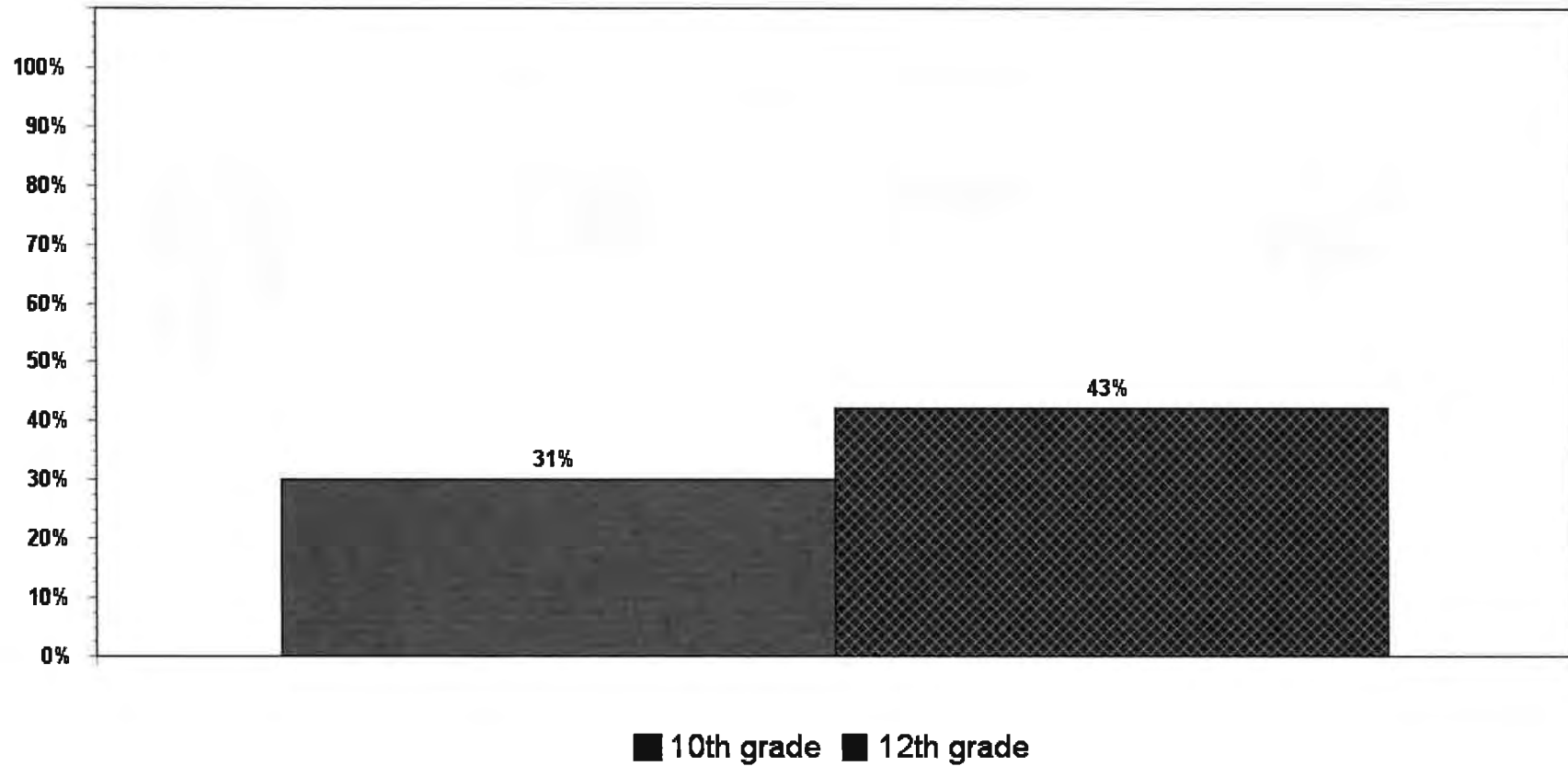
## Driving Under the Influence in the Past Year Among 10th Grade Youth

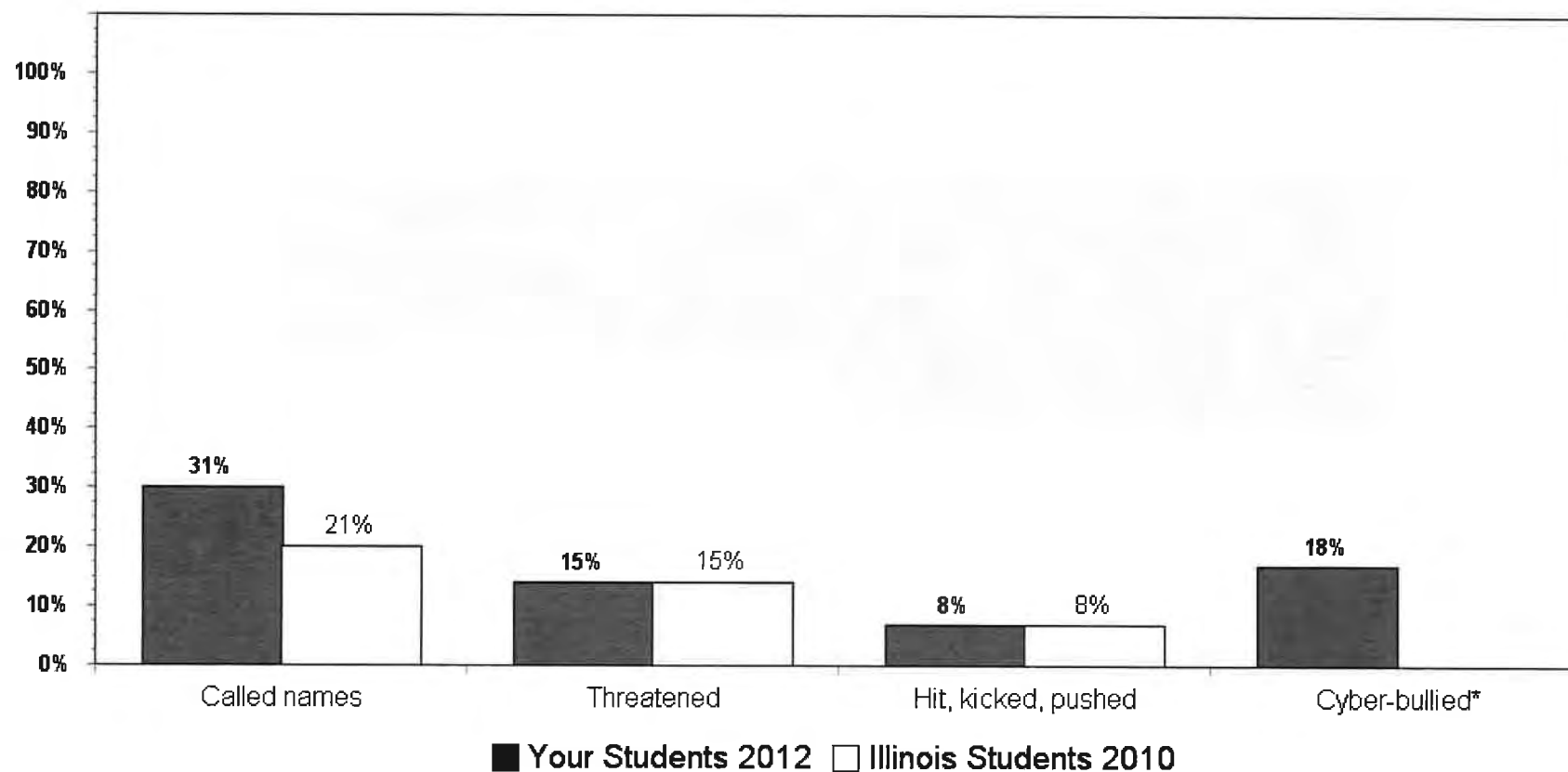


# High School Students Who May Benefit from an Individual Substance Abuse Assessment\* By Grade in 2012



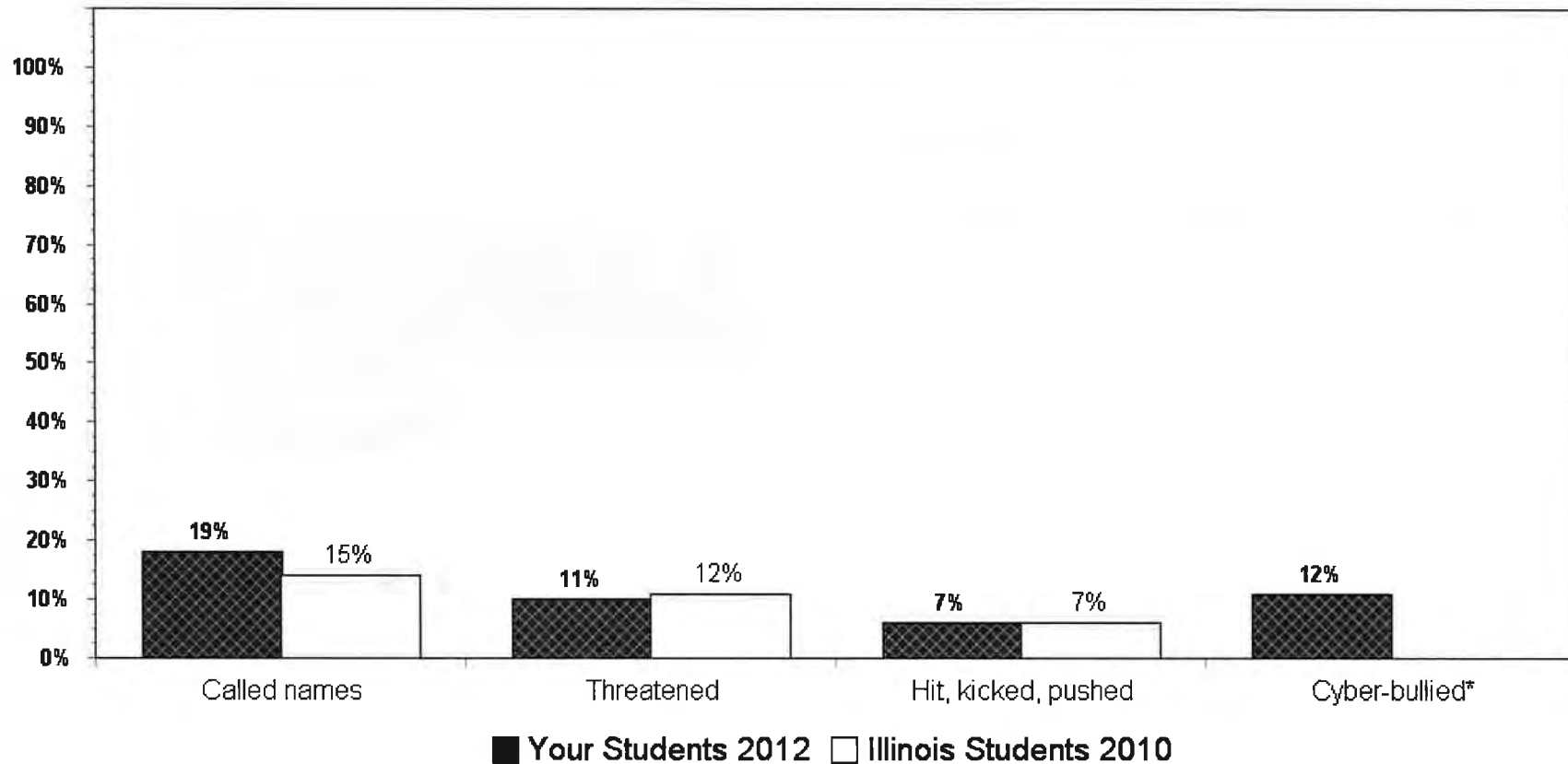

## Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



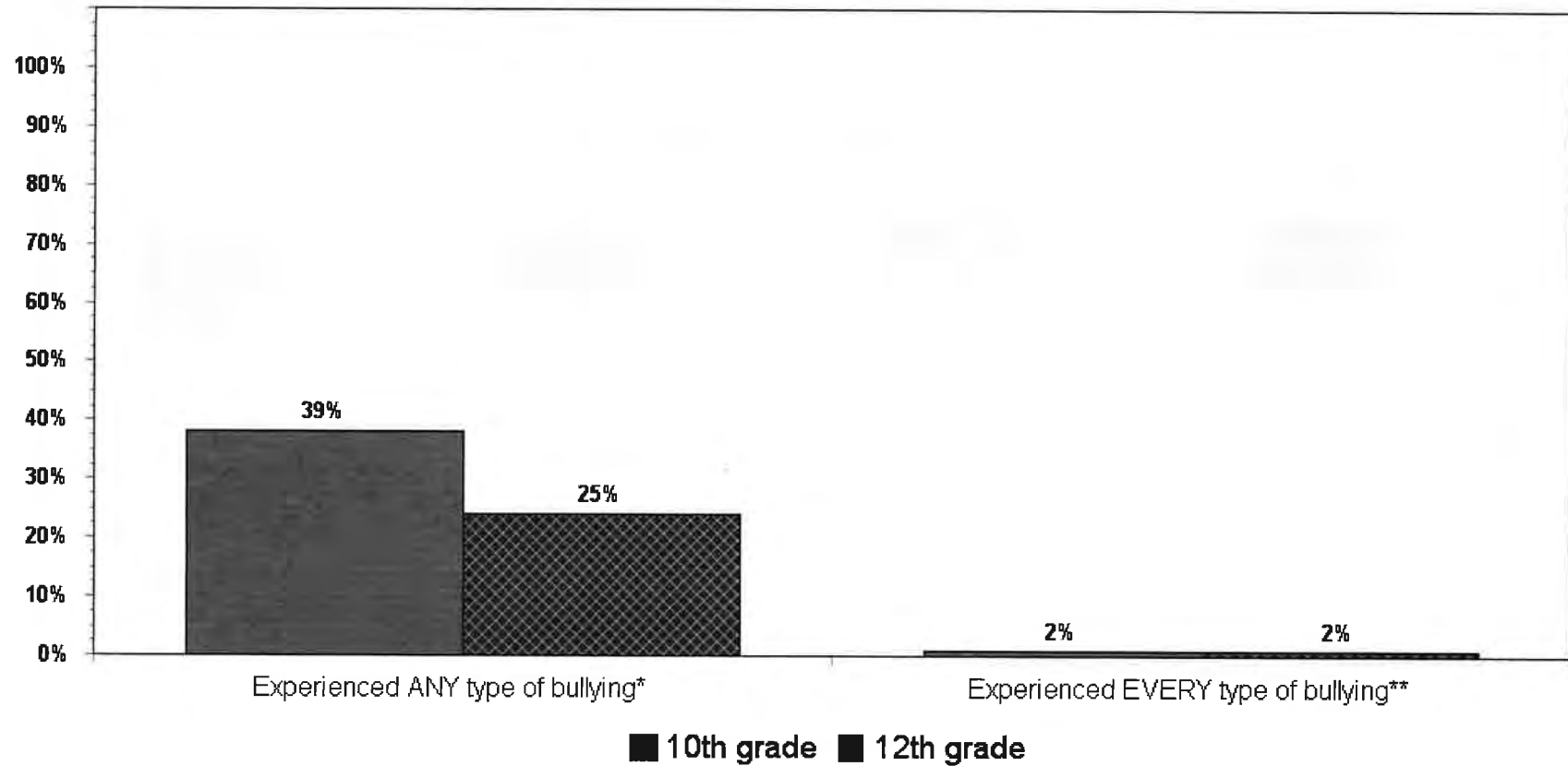

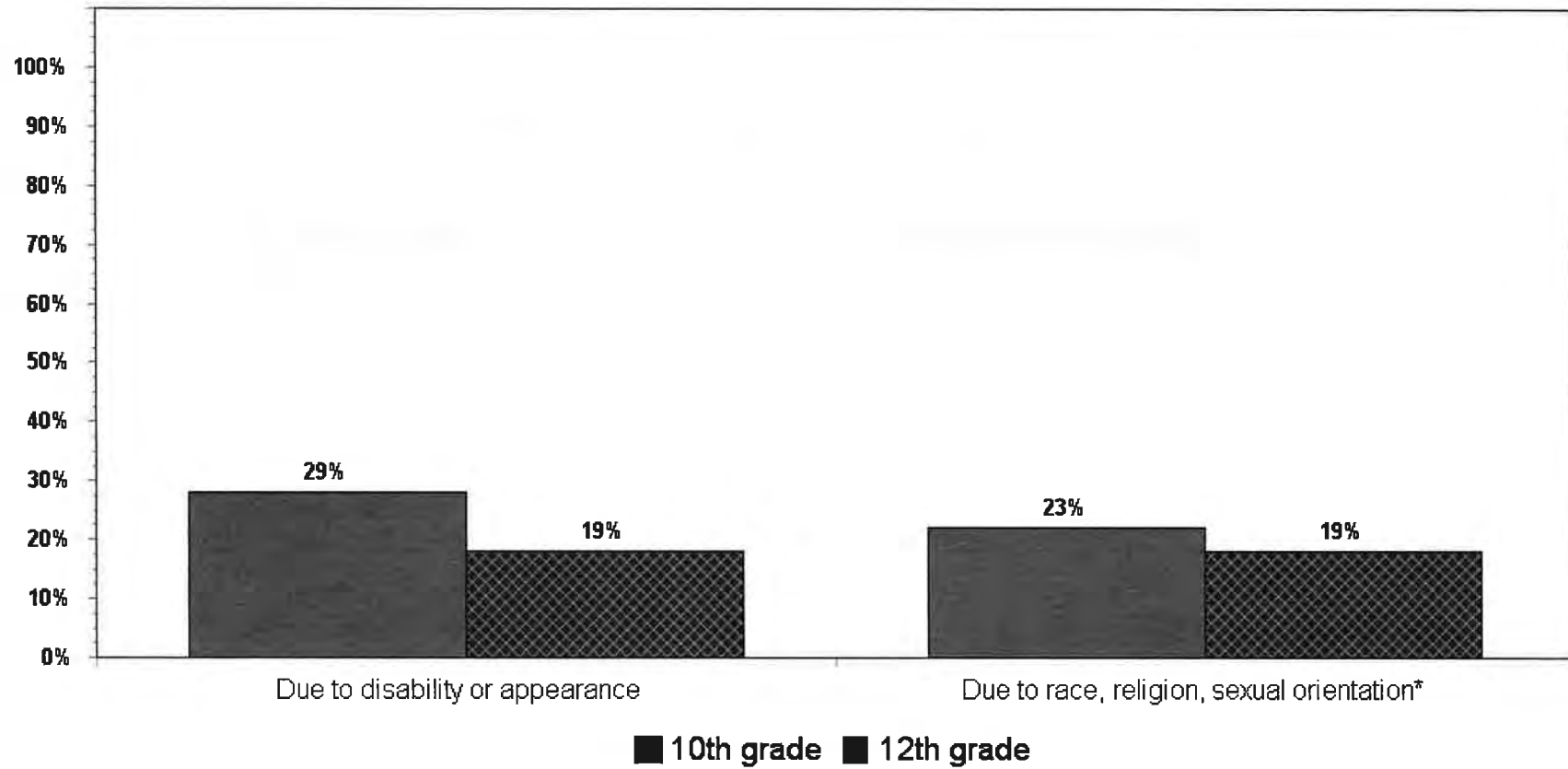
## Extent of Bullying in the Past 12 Months By Grade in 2012

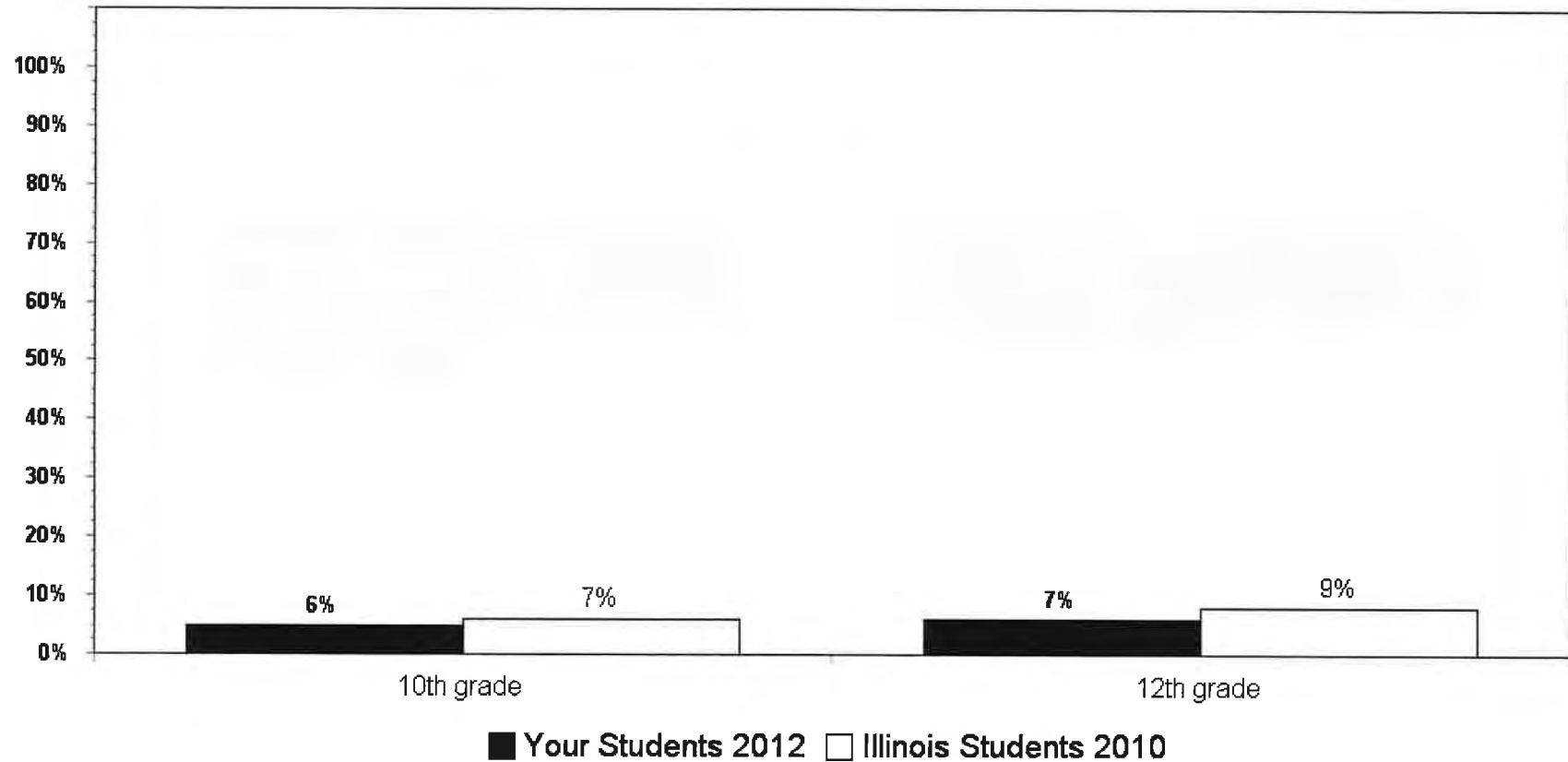
## Bias-Based Bullying Victimization in the Past 12 Months By Grade in 2012

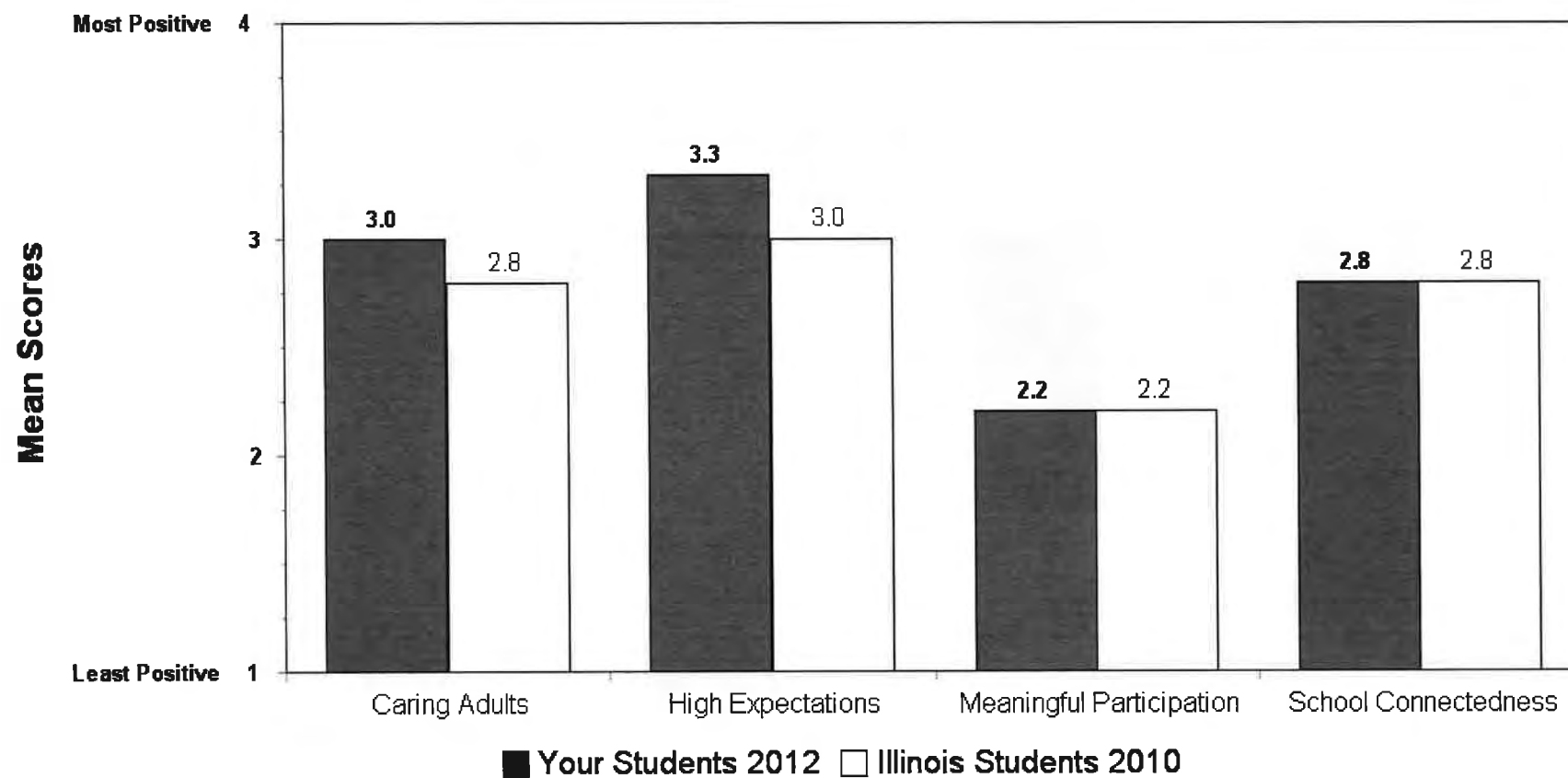


## Dating Violence\* in the Past 12 Months By Grade

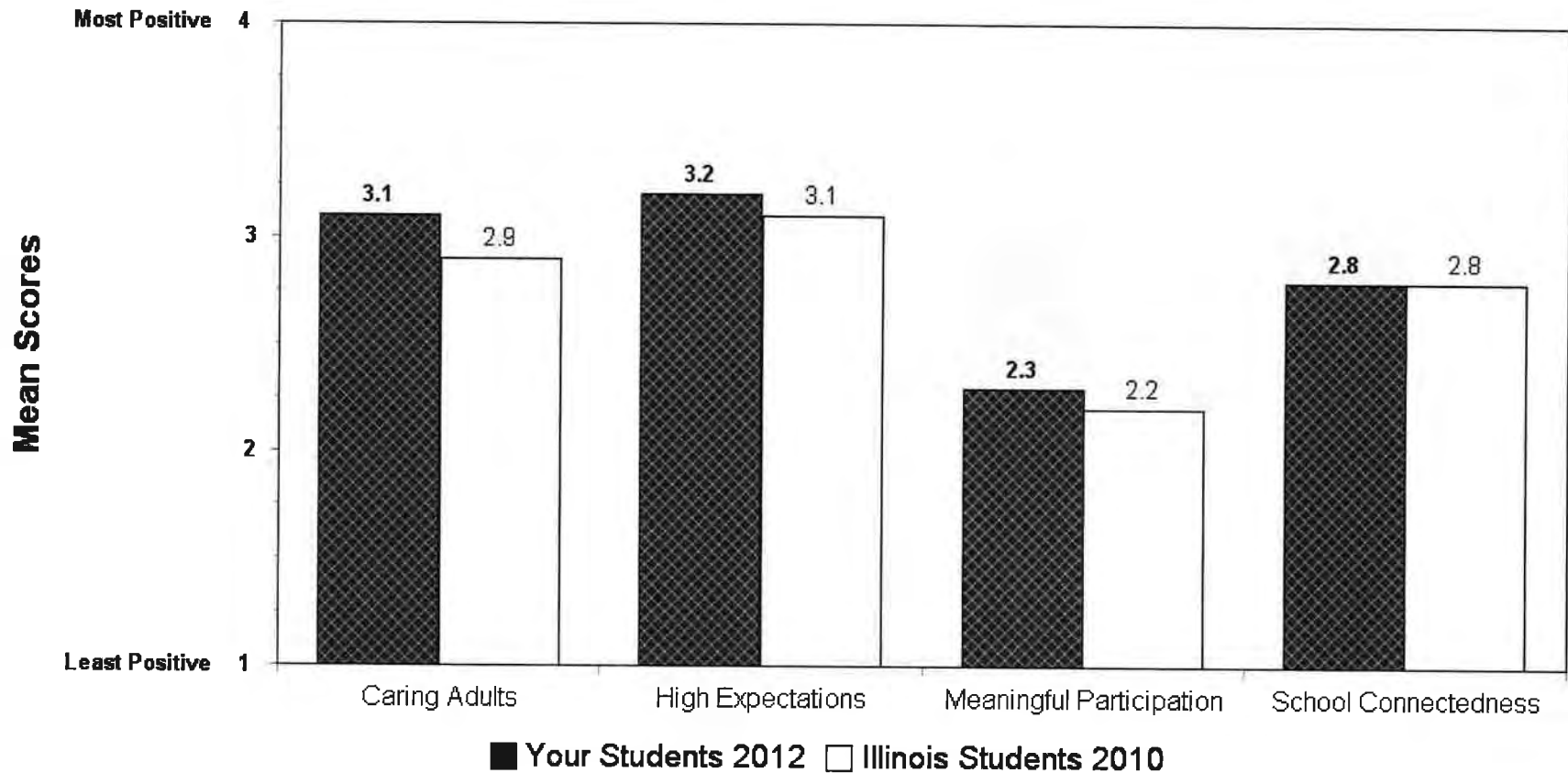

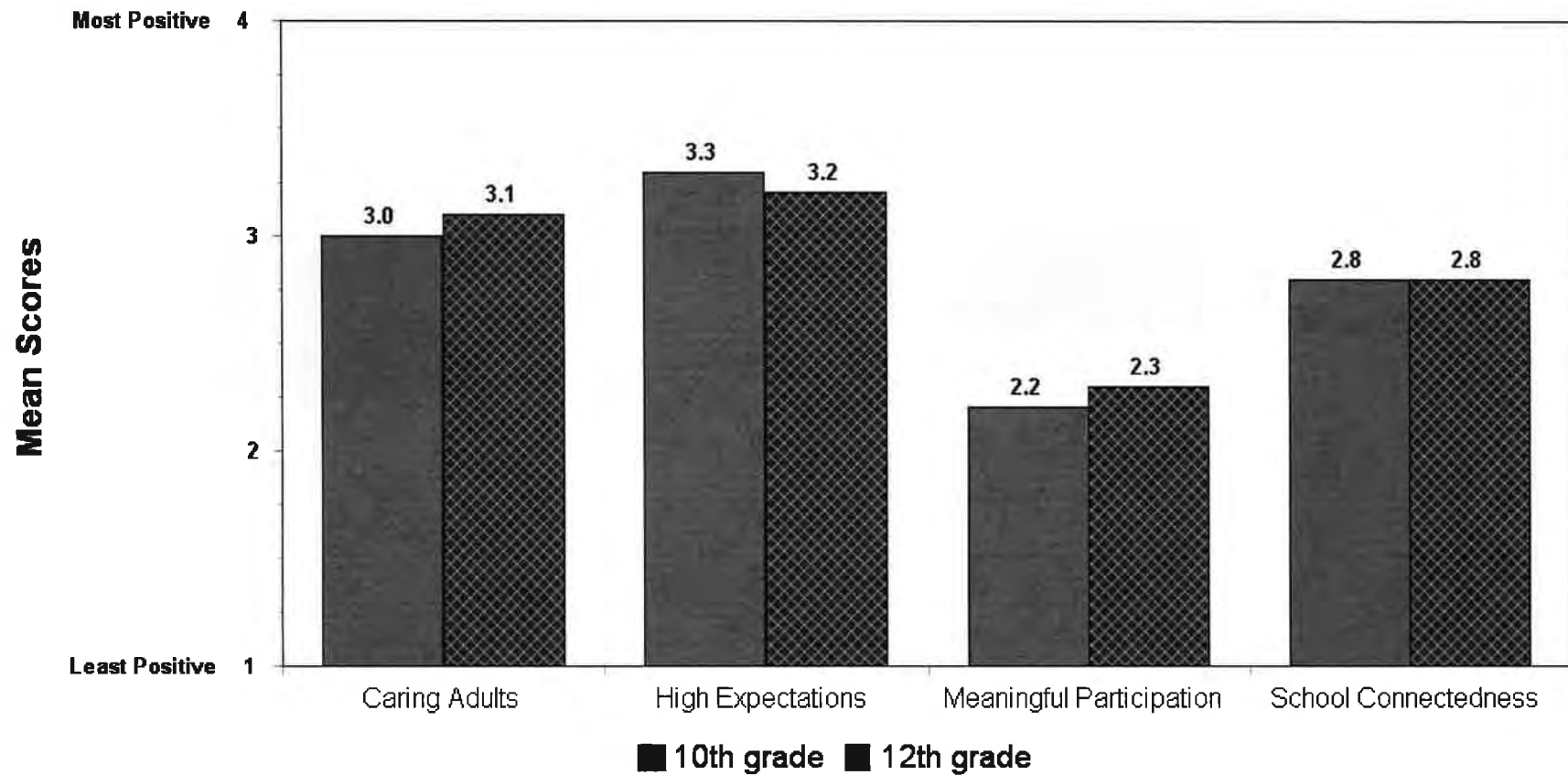
## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 10th Grade Youth



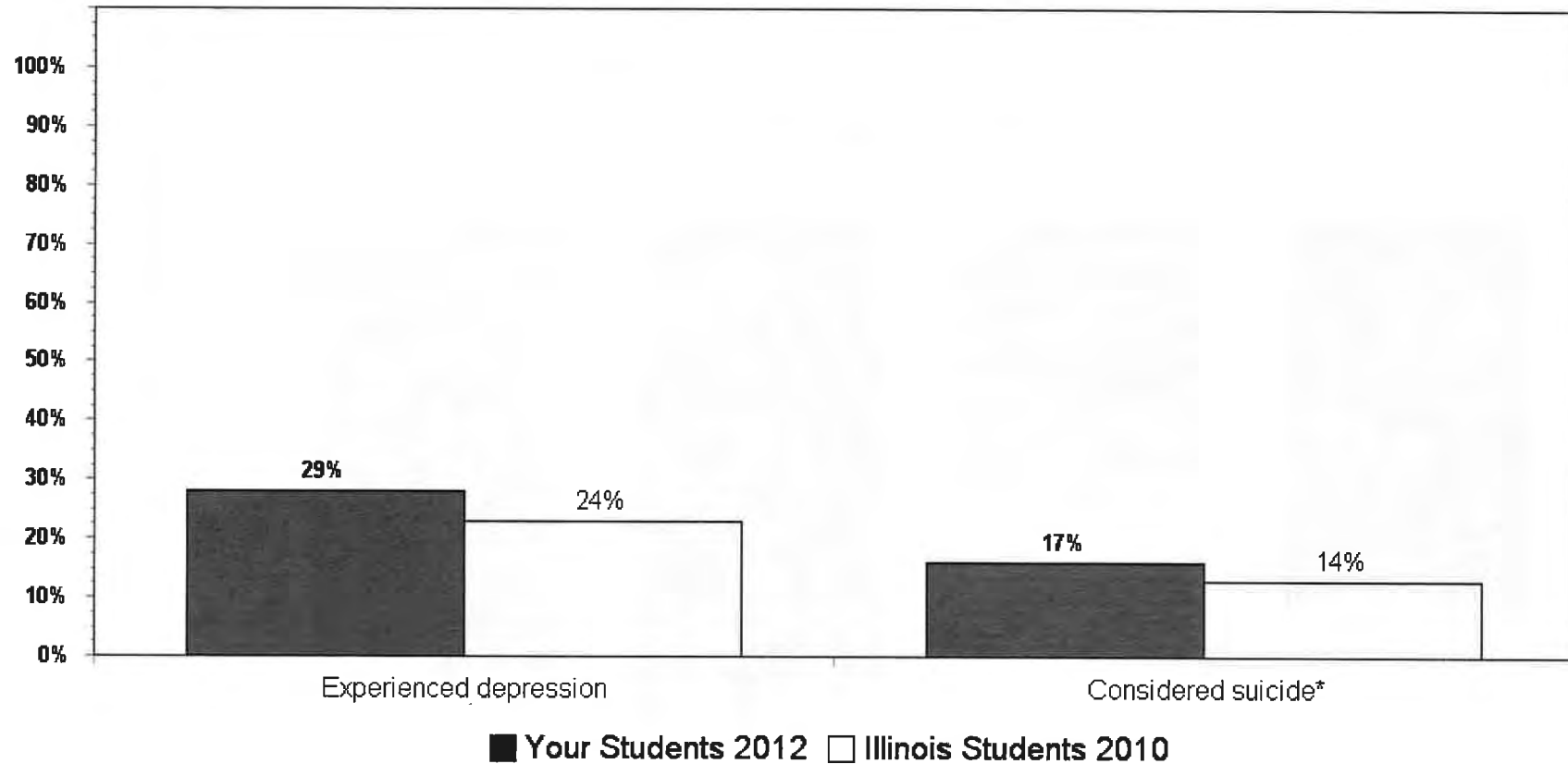
## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores Among 12th Grade Youth



## Student Perceptions of School Climate Mean Scores By Grade in 2012

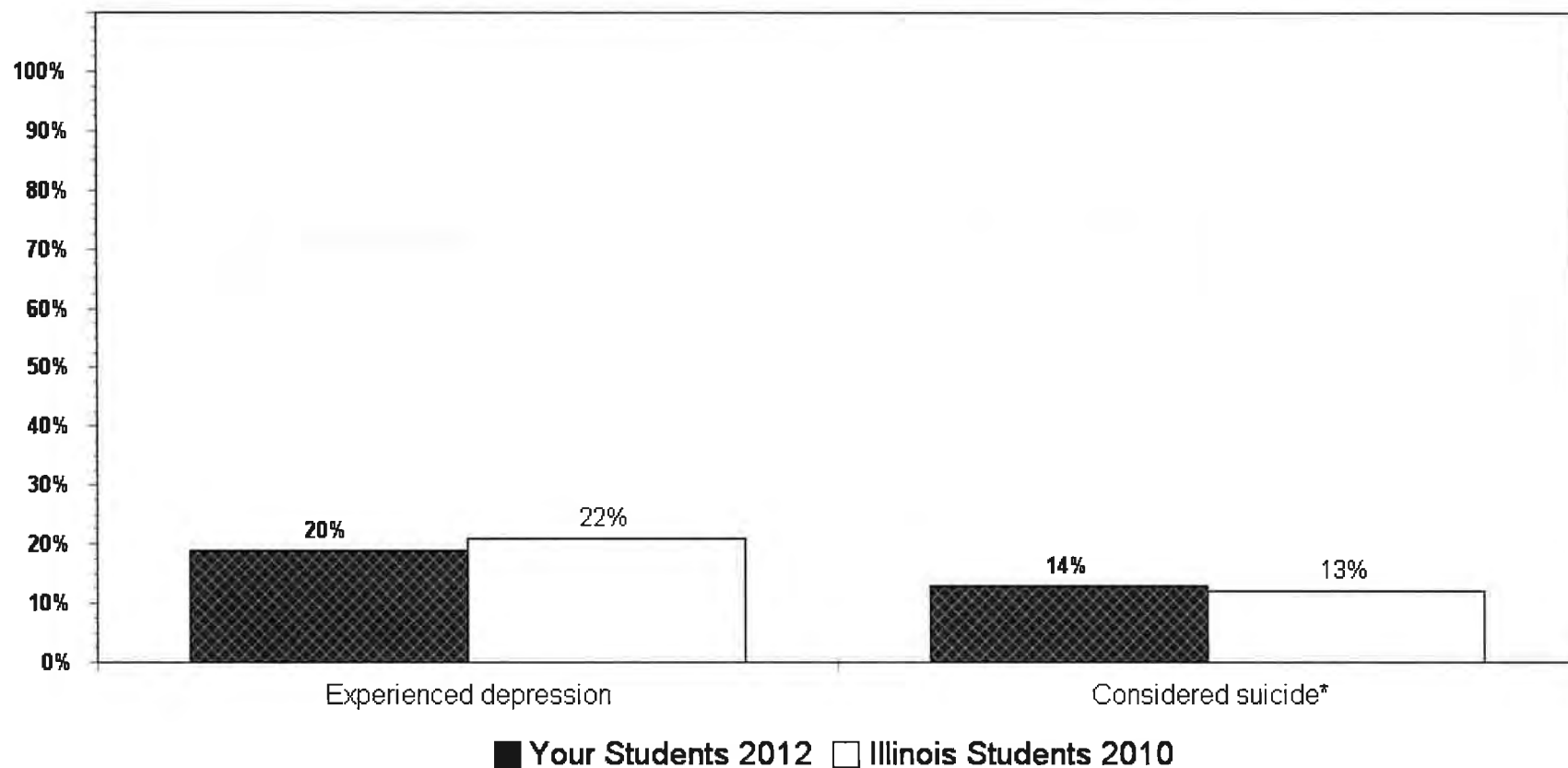


## Mental Health Concerns in the Past 12 Months Among 10th Grade Youth



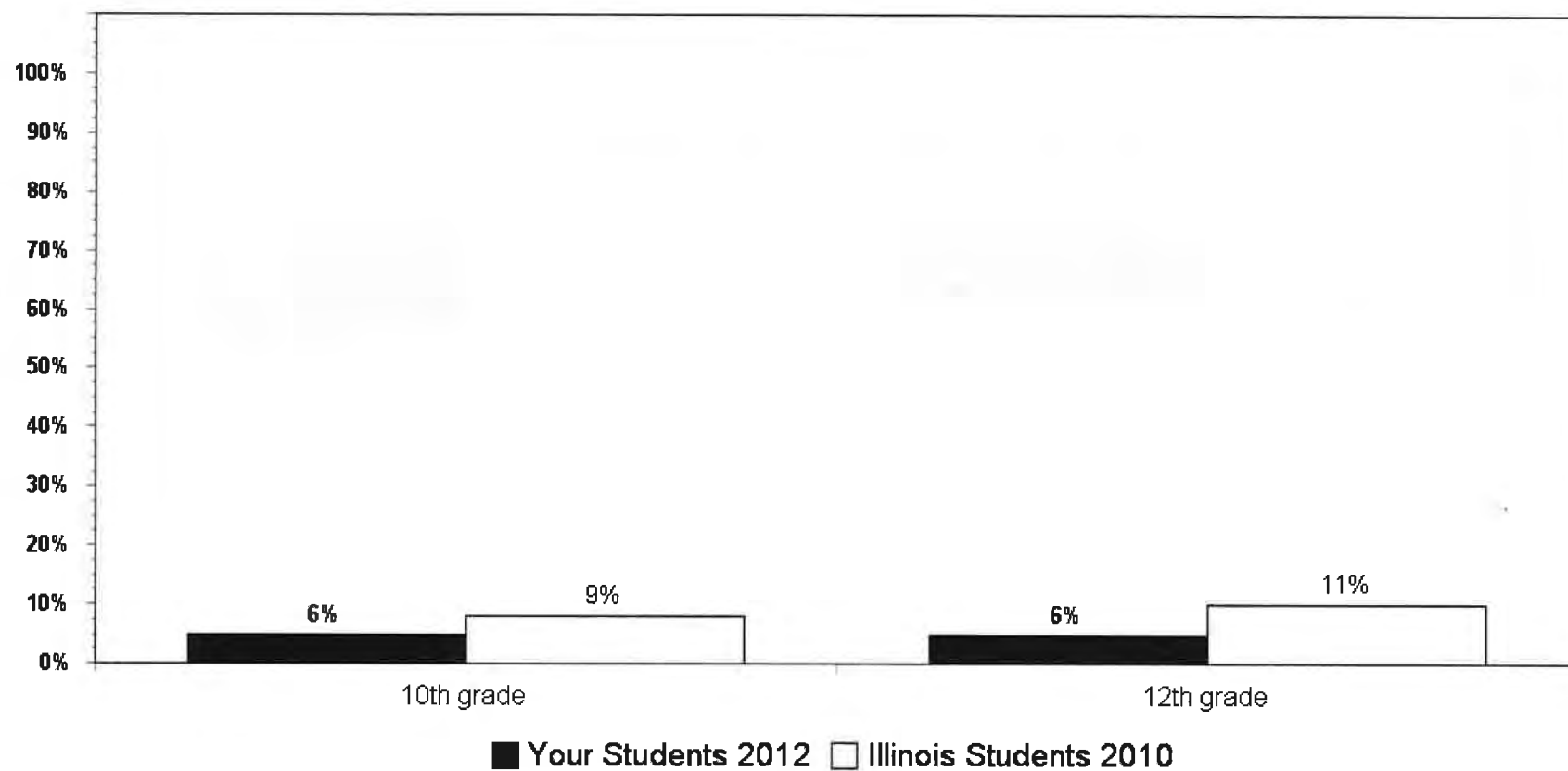

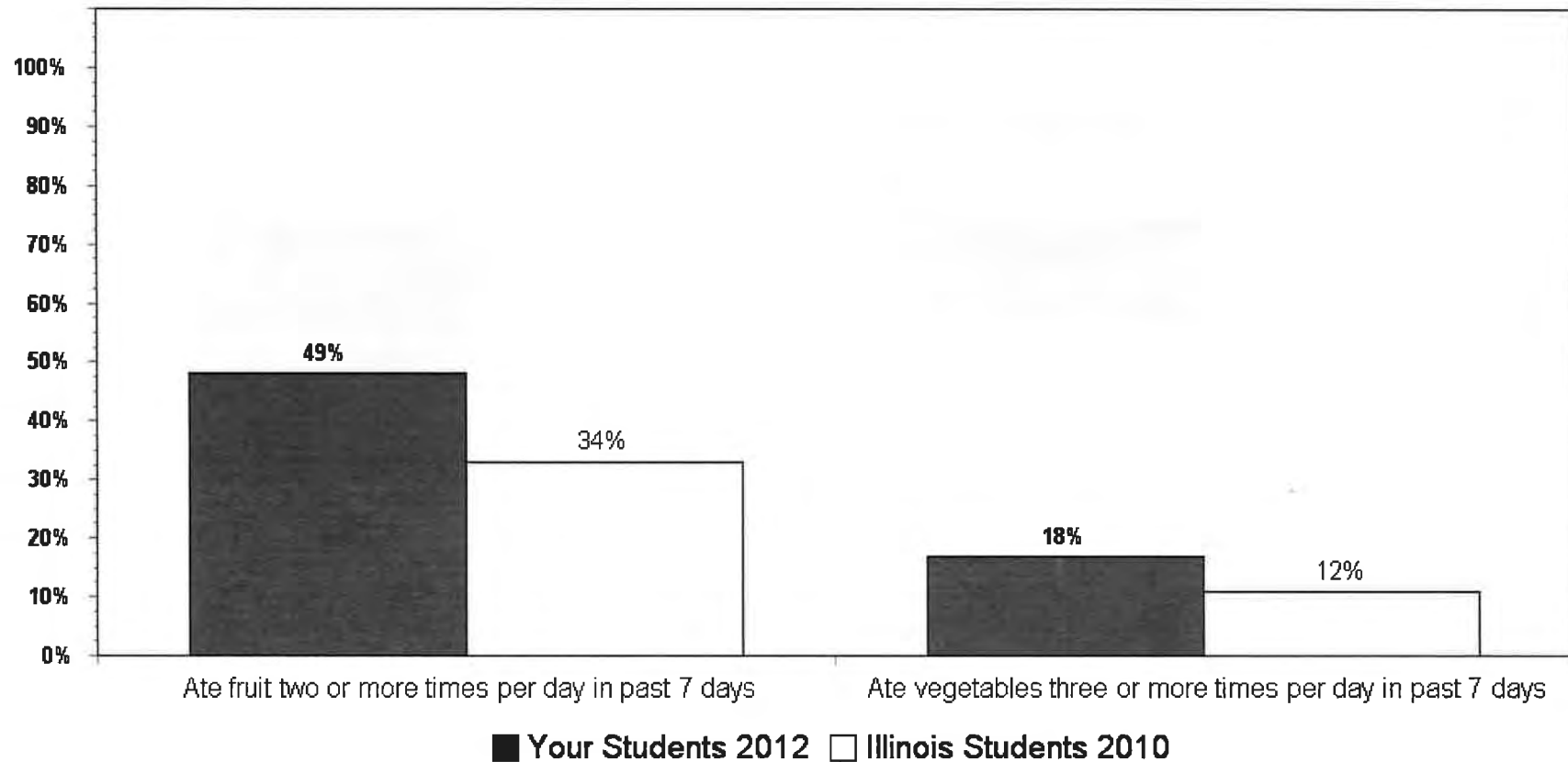

## Prevalence of Obesity\* According to BMI By Grade



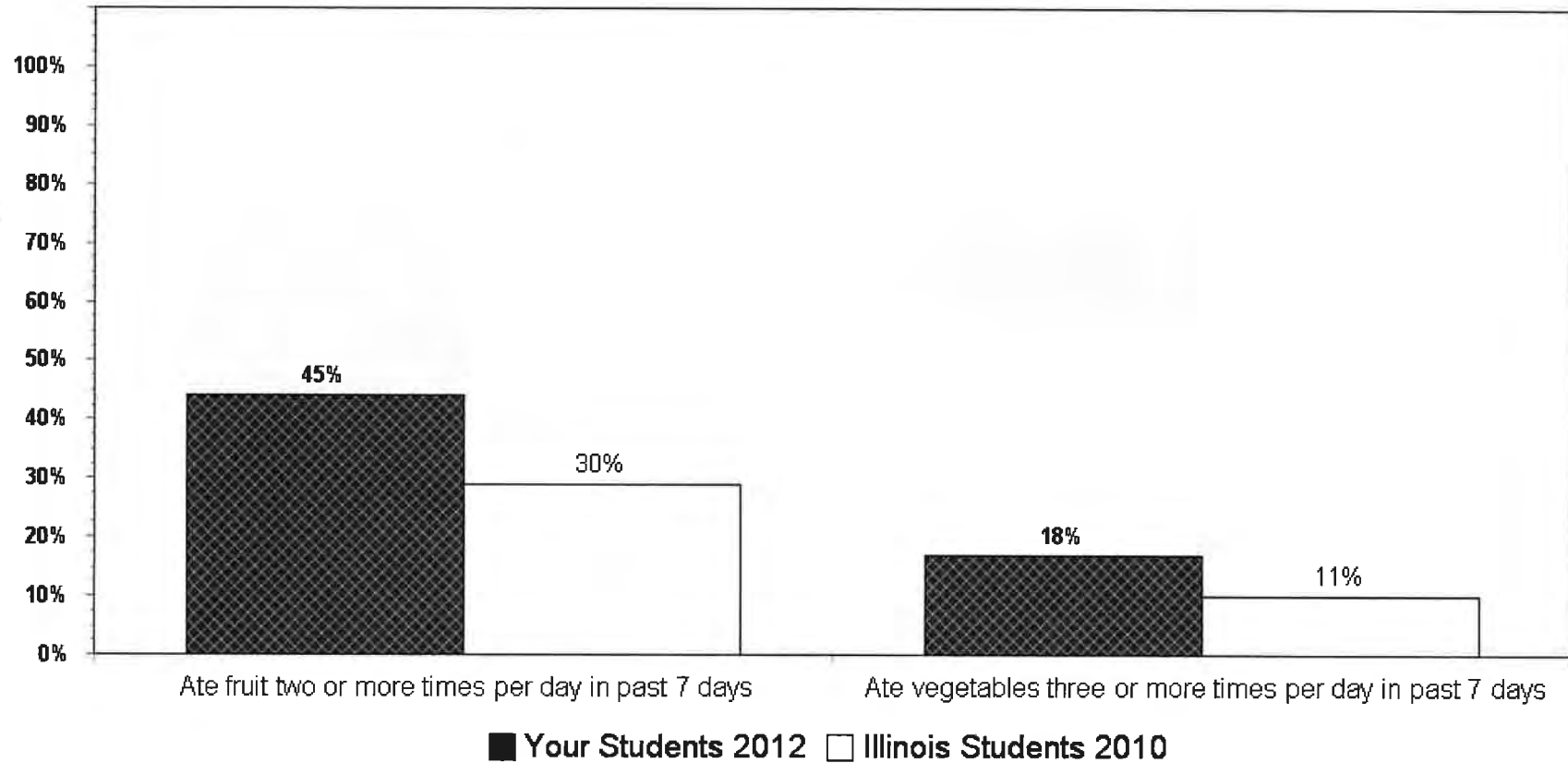

## Nutrition Behavior Among 10th Grade Youth

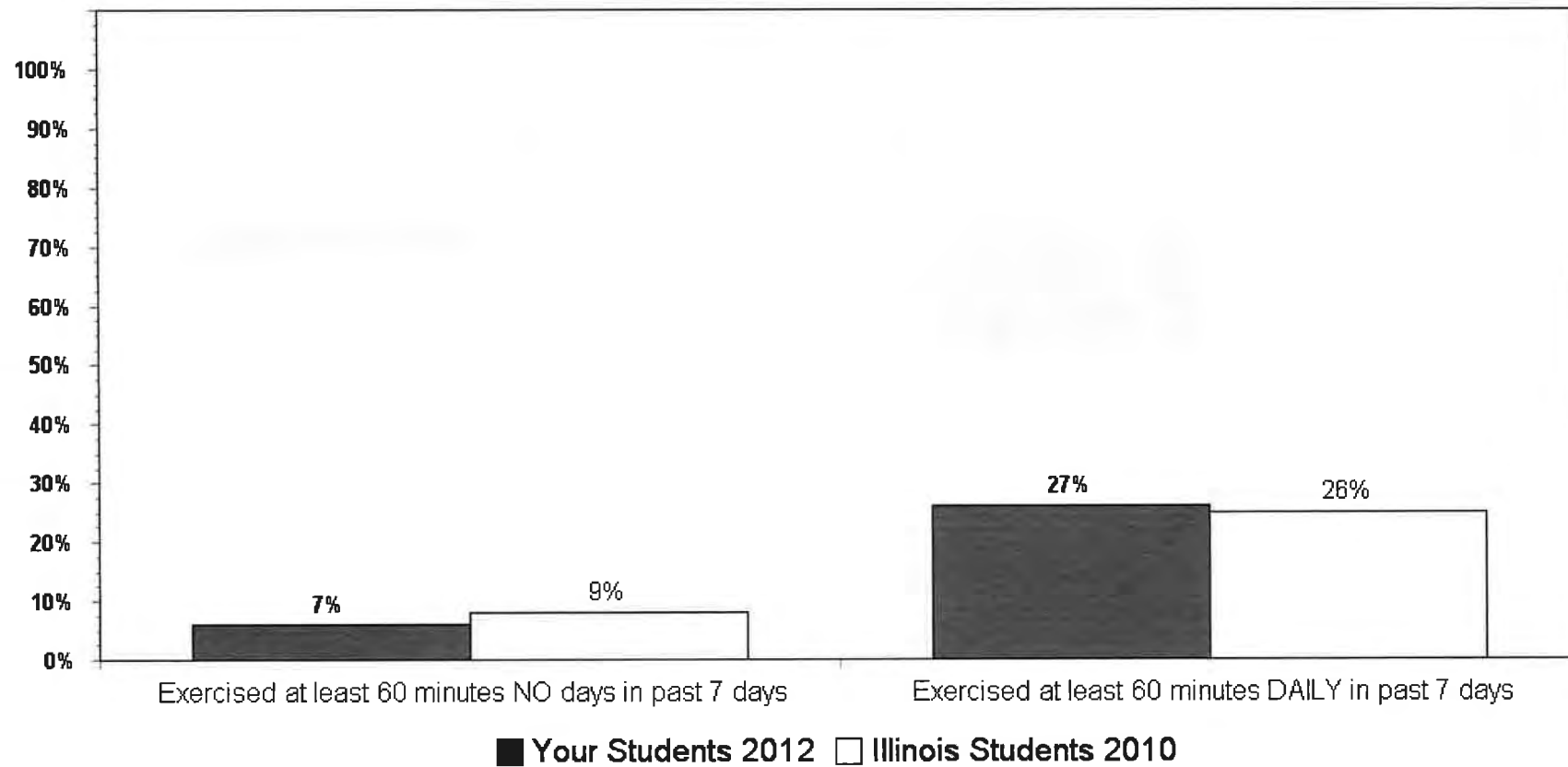




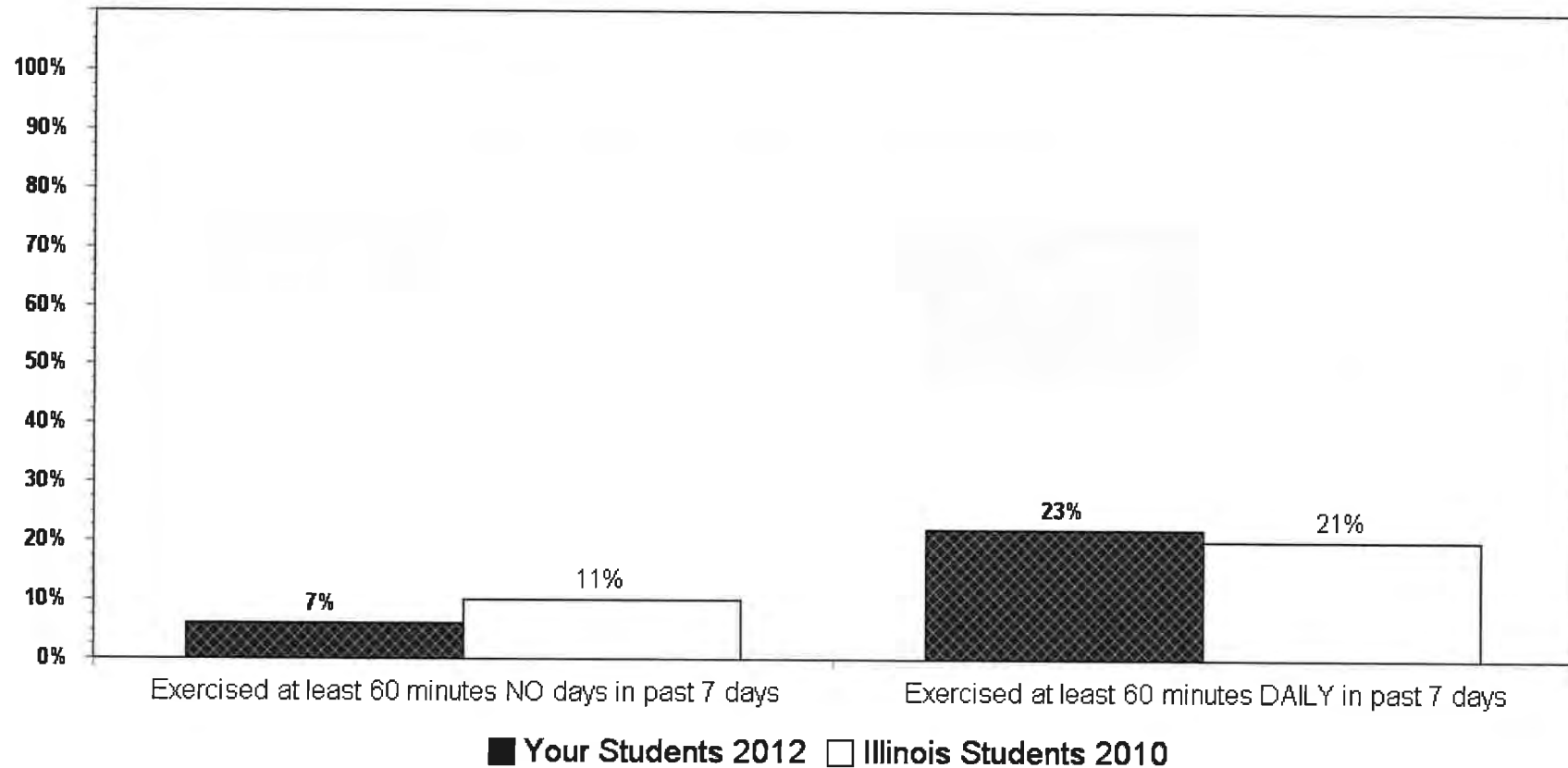
## Nutrition Behavior Among 12th Grade Youth



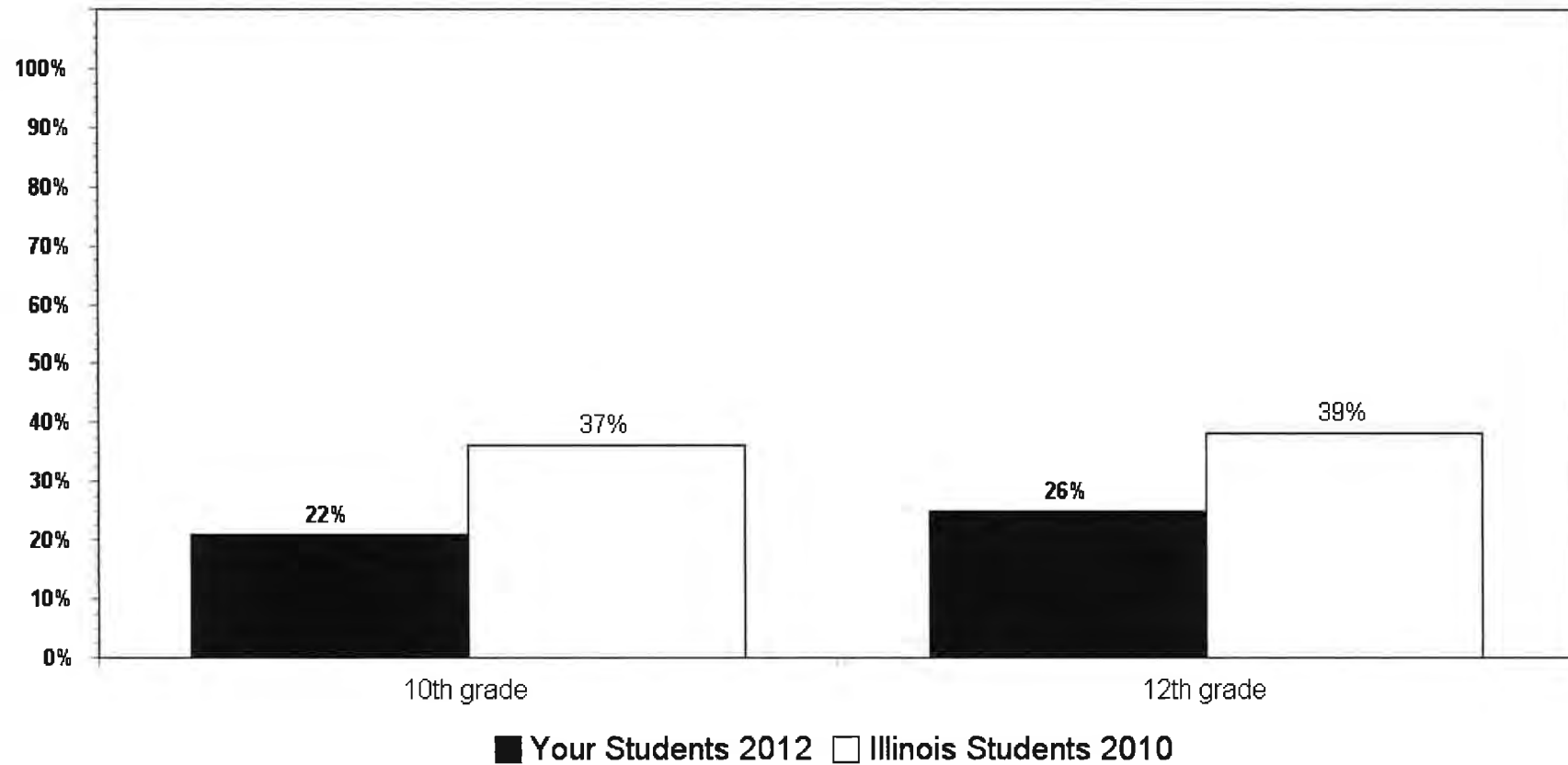
## Frequency of Physical Activity Among 10th Grade Youth
